"Dropping Everything for Jesus"

Imagine an almost perfect stranger coming up to you and telling you to drop everything, to change your ways, and to follow him, no questions asked. It's unlikely that most of us would comply any too quickly. Yet, that is exactly what Christ's first disciples did in today's Gospel passage.


Now, we might think that it was easy for them. After all, we say, they had little to give up aside from backbreaking work and dealing with stinky fish every day. But we would be wrong. These were businessmen with partners and employees, families and homes. They were not wealthy by any stretch of the imagination, and perhaps barely eked out a living for themselves and their families, but they surely were people with something to lose: their livelihood, their way of life, their families, and their lives. Their positive response was as radical and surprising as Jesus' call.

How do we respond to that same call today? Are we prepared to repent of our sins and change our lives, removing all obstacles that separate us from God? Are we ready to drop everything to live the life of Christian discipleship, to take up our crosses each day and even to day down our lives to follow Jesus, Who offers us eternal life? As one Mid-west US bishop put it recently, are we truly committed to following Jesus Christ, or do we simply admire Him from a safe distance?

These are questions that each one of us must answer for ourselves, sooner or later, and the sooner the better. Jesus calls us each day to reject sin and to accept the grace of God in order to live a life of holiness. We may not leave our jobs, families, and homes behind, but each of us must respond with commitment and proclaim our love for Jesus Christ by living as He has commanded us to live.

"Repent, then come and follow Me," He says. May God bless you along your journey of faith and bring you to the fullness of life that Christ has won for us!
