From the Pastor's Desk:

"Coming Home to the Body of Christ"

Today Catholics in the USA celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, aka Corpus Christi. What a difference a year has made in our diocese! Last year, almost all of you were prevented from receiving the Lord sacramentally and had to content yourselves with watching Mass on TV or some other device and offering up an act of spiritual communion (small "c"). Today, not only have we left lock-down mode during which churches were closed and civil authorities did not deem religious worship to be an "essential activity", but, as of today, the obligation for Catholics in good health to attend Sunday Mass has been reinstated in our Diocese.

How many people will actually return to celebrate and receive the Sacrament is anyone's guess, but there is a great spirit of hope and anticipation among many of us in the clergy that the number of Mass attendees will continue to rise, even little by little, just as it has since the reopening of churches. There is a hunger in the human soul, sometimes expressed openly, but more often endured silently though painfully, for the transcendent. The Gift of the Eucharist is what satisfies that desire most adequately for Catholic and Orthodox Christians.

The Sacrament of the Eucharist is no mere sign or symbol that points to a greater reality. It IS the Reality itself, the very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, given to His disciples at the Last Supper and sealed by His Cross and Resurrection. Sadly, for a growing number of Catholics, even among those who participate in Mass regularly, this is a point no longer accepted as a matter of faith. For many, it is only a symbol, a reminder of an event of 2,000 years ago.

No! It is NOT "just a symbol." It is the very Reality of Jesus Christ present in a way unlike any other. While other religious leaders may be present to their followers in a sense through writings and images, it is only Christ Who is really, truly, and substantially present to His disciples under the appearance of bread and wine that have been consecrated and transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In past ages, Christians would defy oppressive secular authorities and strive to celebrate and to receive the Eucharist, even to the point of dying in the attempt. Priests would risk their lives to celebrate Mass and to administer the Sacraments in homes and catacombs, in forests and fields, and on hillside "Mass rocks". Today, we have become cowardly in the face of tyranny and evil, and most people have grown complacent after a year of being told by their own shepherds that Mass attendance, once the central part of their spiritual lives, wasn't required.

While there is grace to be found in every truly devout and pious religious act and experience, watching a Mass on TV or on a screen is NOT the same thing as being physically present at Mass in a church. Offering up "a prayer of spiritual communion", regardless of how uplifting and profoundly sincere it might be, is NOT the same thing as receiving Jesus Christ present *par excellence* in the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist.

So many of you prayed for the day when you'd be able to come to Mass again. That day arrived months ago, thanks be to God! We have taken and continue to take reasonable precautions, especially now that permissible church occupancy is back to 100% of capacity. It is time to come home to the House of God and His people, and to share in the Banquet Feast of Heaven and earth. Wear a mask, if you must, but do come. Bring others with you, lest we just "preach to the choir".

The priests of our Parish, as all priests, stand ready to bring Communion to the sick and the homebound, as needed. We also look forward, however, to welcoming our people in person, to seeing you in the pews, participating at holy Mass, reverently coming forward to receive your Lord in Holy Communion, and to become what we receive: members of the Body of Christ.

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

We're over halfway to the goal for the <u>2021</u> Annual Catholic Appeal campaign. We've received pledges for \$50,598 already from just 125 families against this year's goal of \$76,014. That's 66.6% of goal with \$25,416 to go.

The goal comes to a fair share donation of about \$120 from each of our 650 families. Some can give more, some less, but *everyone can give something*. Will you help to put us over the top? Please prayerfully consider making a pledge this year.

Money raised by this campaign is used to support programs for our elderly and youth, nursing facilities, seminarians and retired priests, and other diocesan and parish pastoral needs.

NEW HYMNAL DECICATIONS

We have put out more hymnals for use by the congregation now that we're back to 100% capacity in the church. Please use one of the forms available in the vestibule to dedicate a hymnal in memory or honor of your intention. The offering is \$25/book.

CHURCH OPEN HOURS

The church will be open only for the celebration of Masses and baptisms. It will be closed at all other times to enable us to clean and sanitize.

The government is easing restrictions somewhat, but *please observe these rules for your safety and that of others:*

- \sim Do <u>NOT</u> enter the church, if you are feeling sick.
- ~ Wearing a facemask or covering is now optional *IF YOU HAVE BEEN VACCINATED*, but please consider those around you who still are not vaccinated or who may be on edge.
- ~ Seating regulations remain ambiguous. Families or couples are allowed to sit together, but individuals still should try to observe some social distancing for now.
