From the Pastor's Desk:

"On Faith, Part II"

In last week's commentary on faith, I said that faith is not merely an assent of the mind to doctrines and dogmas but, more especially, is a matter of entrusting ourselves to God through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, in Whom we have come to new life as members of His Body and children of God. This is the work of a lifetime.

We grow in our relationship with the people around us, entrusting ourselves to them more fully over time. So it should be with our relationship with Christ, which not only helps us along the roads of life as things are going well, but also enables us to get through the tough, difficult, and crazy times that always seem to find us. Sadly, it sometimes takes a matter of desperation before we place ourselves fully into the hands of the Lord.

Such is the case in today's Gospel in which St. Mark presents two stories of faith in what scripture scholars refer to as a "Marcan sandwich", beginning one story, and then introducing a complete second story before concluding the original (sort of like putting a piece of cheese between two slices of bread). In this case, it's a matter of two incidents of desperation in which the main characters trust in Christ's power to heal and to restore life, i.e., to perform the work of God. Both acts of desperation are tied to a determination and a conviction about Christ's ability and His desire to oblige in dire situations. The same Christ desires to heal us and to bring us into the fullness of life.

The first reading today reminds us that God's intent was that we should live for all eternity in His company but that the commission of the original sin by our spiritual parents, Adam and Eve, brought about both spiritual and physical death. St. Ambrose taught that God was actually merciful in allowing for physical death, lest we should suffer too greatly from the burdens and pains of an endless, agonizing life in our fallen state. Moreover, God has been even more merciful in sending us His Son for the forgiveness of sin, to bring about our healing and reconciliation so that we might live for all eternity in His presence after all.

As God has dealt mercifully with us in Christ, St. Paul reminds us, we, too, are to deal mercifully with those around us. We do not raise the dead or cure the infirm in a literal sense as Christ did, but we can do so in another sense by the way that we treat people with kindness, mercy, and compassion, addressing their needs as best we can, and to be the presence of Christ Whose Name we bear. This, too, requires us to entrust ourselves to the Lord, for apart from Him we can do nothing.

What does it take for us to entrust ourselves to Christ with the faith of Jairus, the dying/dead girl's father, or with that of the woman who has spent her savings and years seeking a cure from more conventional, albeit ineffective, methods? Unlike them, we have the benefit of a long-term relationship with Christ, begun in the waters of Baptism, developed in the course of our lifetime, and guided and nourished by Him through His Word and His Sacraments. Yet, we hesitate. Do we really need to be at the end of our rope before we turn to the Lord and place ourselves confidently in His hands?

Christ told the suffering woman that her faith, her trust in Him, had saved her. Sinners that we are, let us embrace Him and entrust ourselves to His mercy, not merely to "touch the tassel of His cloak" but rather to receive Him with great love and devotion each day, and then to use the grace of His presence in us to live the life of our calling as members of His Body and children of God! May we, too, hear Him say to us one day, "Your faith has saved you!"

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL
