From the Pastor's Desk:

"Dig Deeper, Look Higher"

Once again, our Gospel passage comes from John 6, the "Bread of Life Discourse". Confusion has set in among the people. How could Jesus be Who He says He is, when they know His parents and family? After all, didn't He grow up in their midst? As often happens in the Gospel according to St. John, however, Jesus speaks on one level and the people understand on another. It would require a leap of faith for them to accept His words. Lest we fault them, though, His message requires the exact same leap of faith from us almost 2,000 years later.

Most people today probably have no problem in accepting Jesus as philosopher Who taught a simple, ethical and humane way of life. But "Son of God" and "Bread of Life"? That's pressing it a bit too far. Nevertheless, either He is exactly the latter two terms, or He is nothing. What's more, His promises are nothing and meaningless, if He is not entirely and truly Who He claims to be.

No other religious leader or founder of any other religion in history ever made the statements that Jesus did. Certainly, none other ever has been able to deliver what He promises: the offering of His own Flesh for His followers that they might have eternal life and find strength to put the commands of His Heavenly Father into effect.

So, let's get back to us and that giant leap of faith. What do we believe we are receiving as we take the Host, why are we receiving it, and how have we prepared to receive it? The 20th Century American author, Flannery O'Connor, when told in conversation by a fellow dinner guest that the Eucharist was only a symbol replied, "Well, if it's only a symbol, the hell with it!" For her, as for us, either the Eucharist is the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ given sacramentally to His Church for all time for our salvation, or It is nothing. If It is nothing, then why receive It? It is not to be reduced to being just a talisman or lucky charm. That would be committing a sacrilege with eternally painful consequences.

The second question, then, is, why do we receive It? The answer to this is multi-faceted. We receive It as an outward sign of our communion with Christ and one another as members of His Mystical Body, the Church. We are to be united in faith and in action as a prerequisite. We receive It because we recognize Its divine Reality. Like the Prophet Elijah in the first reading, we receive It as food for our journey, our lifelong journey to the Kingdom of Heaven, that we might be strengthened in holiness by the grace it gives and so live according to the Word of God and the teachings of Christ that have been handed down to us by the Church.

How, then, do we prepare to receive It properly? Although the Eucharist brings about the remission of venial sins, we are to be in a state of grace first, free especially from any mortal sin. This in turn requires formal, personal confession in the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Yet, how long the Communion lines are at Mass, and how quiet the confessionals are on Saturday afternoons! Are we all so holy and sinless?

Furthermore, what do we do when we come to Mass? How do we spend the time before Mass begins? Do we enter into a period of quiet, prayerful recollection, or is it a time for catching up on the latest news? How do we receive the sacred Host? Is it with reverence and profound respect, or is it with an attitude of nonchalance? St. John Chrysostom (+407) taught that we should stretch out our hands in awe, as if we were about to have gold dust poured into them, and then consume the Sacrament with great love and devotion.

If our response to any of these questions is not along the positive lines that I have suggested in this brief writing, perhaps it's time for us to dig deeper and look higher. The miracle of the true Bread come down from Heaven, the Son of the Father, and our food for the journey to eternal life, is present to us. How will you respond to His claims? How will I?

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

We're over two-thirds to the goal for the <u>2021</u> Annual Catholic Appeal campaign. We've received pledges for \$69,153 already from just 153 families against this year's goal of \$76,014. That's 91.0% of goal with \$6,861 to go.

The goal comes to a fair share donation of about \$120 from each of our 650 families. Some can give more, some less, but *everyone can give something*. Will you help to put us over the top? *Please prayerfully consider making a pledge this year*.

Money raised by this campaign is used to support programs for our elderly and youth, nursing facilities, seminarians and retired priests, and other diocesan and parish pastoral needs.
