

From the Pastor's Desk:

"We Interrupt This Discourse...."

The Gospel readings for the last few weeks have come from the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to St. John, aka the "Bread of Life Discourse". Today we interrupt that continuity, skipping a very important passage (see below), as we commemorate the assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven. It is the ancient and constant belief of the Church that Mary was given the singular grace and distinction of not undergoing decay when her lifetime on earth had come to an end, but was brought, body and soul, into the fullness of eternal life through her participation in the merits of the salvific action of her divine Son.

That's enough to cause the head of any scholarly theologian to spin. So, I defer to Venerable Pope Pius XII and quote two excerpts from his 1950 Apostolic Constitution, "Munificentissimus Deus":

"In their homilies and sermons on this feast the holy Fathers and great Doctors spoke of the assumption of the Mother of God as something already familiar and accepted by the faithful. They gave it greater clarity in their preaching and used more profound arguments in setting out its nature and meaning. Above all, they brought out more clearly the fact that what is commemorated in this feast is not simply the total absence of corruption from the dead body of the Blessed Virgin Mary but also her triumph over death and her glorification in Heaven, after the pattern of her only Son, Jesus Christ."

"Hence, the august Mother of God, mysteriously united from all eternity with Jesus Christ in one and the same decree of predestination, immaculate in her conception, a virgin inviolate in her divine motherhood, the whole-hearted companion of the divine Redeemer Who won complete victory over sin and its consequences, gained at last the supreme crown of her privileges: to be preserved immune from the corruption of the tomb, and, like her Son, when death had been conquered, to be carried up body and soul to the exalted glory of Heaven, there to sit in splendor at the right hand of her Son, the immortal King of the ages."

In short, Mary, who had shared in the mission of her Son from His conception in her heart and in her womb to His glorious ascension into Heaven, share, by His merits and the favor of the Father, in the fullness of life in the Kingdom of Heaven.

As she has followed her Son, so we hope one day to follow her. May we imitate the loving and humble obedience to the will of the Father of this first and best disciple of Christ and so come to share with her in the eternal life that He has won!

It will help us to understand next week's Gospel, if we read and reflect upon the passage that would have been proclaimed today, beginning with the last verse from last week (John 51-58):

"[Jesus said to the crowd] 'I am the living bread which came down from Heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live for ever, for the bread that I will give for the life of the world is My flesh.' The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus said to them, 'Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you. He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the Last Day. For My flesh is food indeed, and My blood is drink indeed. He who eats My flesh and drinks my blood abides in Me, and I in him. As the living Father sent Me, and I have life because of the Father, so he who eats of Me will live because of Me. This is the bread which came down from Heaven, not such as your fathers ate and died nonetheless; he who eats this bread will live for ever.'"

Now, THAT should make YOUR head spin. Reflect on how YOU react to these words, and then come back next week to find out how His audience reacted.
