From the Pastor's Desk:

"To Whom Shall We Go?"

This Sunday we conclude the "Bread of Life Discourse", Jesus' proclamation about Himself as the Bread come down from Heaven that brings the one who receives Him to everlasting life. St. John honestly records that this caused no little dissention among His followers, many (not just some) of whom rejected Him and returned to their former way of life. This brings up a couple of interesting points.

First, we need to remember that the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ is not a social club or a human aid society or a prayer circle. It is a participation in a way of life by which her members put the teachings of Christ into practice in the course of everyday events. We are not merely individuals but rather are joined to one another and to Christ by virtue of our common baptism and share the common goal of eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Secondly, in order to assist us in living out this life and attaining this goal, Christ has given us the Sacraments, His means of remaining with His Church. In particular, He has given us His very self in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, "the Bread come down from Heaven," as He put it.

Third, His teachings are not easy to accept, no less to put into practice. They require faith, and faith is a gift from the Father that He gives freely but must be accepted equally freely by the recipient and allowed to take effect in each life. Faith is the underlying principle, if you will, for all that we do as Christ's disciples. Why would we follow Him, if we don't believe in Him or what He says in the first place? This is the problem that those who turned away had.

Each person in each generation is called to make a decision about allowing the grace of God into his/her life. We see it in the first reading today in which Joshua demanded that the people declare one way or the other whether they would serve God or some pagan deity. His declaration to the people is one of the most powerful and beautiful in all of Scripture: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." It turned into a rallying cry for the people, who followed suit.

Jesus asks His apostles in today's Gospel, "Do you also want to leave?" to which St. Peter makes his very bold and confident confession of faith: "Master, to whom [else] shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe, and are convinced, that You are the Holy One of God."

Christ asks us the same question today. Sadly, the second largest religious denomination in the USA today is that of former Catholics. I should like to think that their falling away is the result of their disappointment with the Church as an institution, but there are many among them, and many others who remain in the Church today and receive Communion, who do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament. This is a pity, for their denial is a denial of the very words of Christ: "I am the Bread that came down from heaven . . . [so that] whoever eats this bread will live forever." "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you." "Take and eat, for this is My body." "Take and drink, for this is My blood." What a terrible trick He has played on us, on all humanity, if the only ones to receive His body and blood, and thereby gain eternal life, were the Apostles who sat and ate at the Last Supper.

The Gift that we celebrate and share is no mere symbol or remembering of an incident of twenty centuries ago. It is the living Real Presence of Christ Himself in the Church throughout the ages. We need to remember that every time that we present ourselves to receive Him at holy Mass and not be so nonchalant about it.

May we answer Christ by living our lives in agreement with the words of Saint Peter and Joshua! And may we receive Him reverently and properly in the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist that He gives to His faithful disciples, a share even now in the eternal Banquet Feast of Heaven!
