

From the Pastor's Desk:

"No Longer Two, but One"

The story is told of an ancient rabbi commenting on today's first reading. "Notice," he said, "that the Lord did not take the woman from the man's foot, that he should walk all over her. Neither did He take her from his head, that she might have dominion over him. Rather the Lord God took the woman from the man's side, that they might walk together in equal dignity before His eyes."

The narrative presented to us in today's first reading from Genesis is not a scientific treatise but the expression of a theological point: God created human beings with a certain complementarity of relationship. While the man was to have dominion over the rest of Creation (as indicated by God giving him the power and authority to name the other creatures), he could find none suitable to take as his "partner", his equal, from among all the other beings. The woman, represented as being taken from the man's side, and the man himself are united in a particular union, a communion of persons bound by covenant as one flesh and one spirit.

This idea of the nature of human beings also sheds light on the nature of God: a communion of Persons, yet one God. It is why Christ speaks of the permanence and indissolubility of the marital bond. Once established between a man and a woman, the sacramental bond of Holy Matrimony - - as re-presentative of the unions of the Trinity Itself, between God and His People, and between Christ and His Church - - is a bond that cannot be broken or undone.

We live at a time such as none before, when the very concept of marriage has been warped and distorted and debased into a broad range of relationships, none even closely approximating the original scope, purpose, and beauty of true marriage. Call these other relationships whatever you may, they are not "marriages" at all. Neither do they attain, nor have they the ability to achieve, the bond and the resulting fruitfulness of life that marriage produces within itself.

We know all too well that traditional marriage is entered into less and less frequently each year, while co-habitation and all sorts of "unions" are on the rise. We also realize that marriages can become difficult or strained and even fall apart. Often one or both of the parties can be wounded by the collapse and separation and in need of the Church's pastoral attention and care.

While perfect marriages may be made in Heaven, they are meant to be lived here on earth. Marriage, when properly and fully entered into between a man and a woman as daily ministers of the grace of God to each other, is a permanent relationship, a covenantal bond of the mutual giving of the self and receiving of the other in a life of self-sacrificial love and, when needed, mutual forgiveness. The ultimate goal of husband and wife is to bring one another into the fullness of life in Heaven, the Kingdom of God.

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus confirms the indissolubility of marriage and then turns to little children as role models for His disciples to follow to enter the Kingdom. Small wonder, as children possess genuineness and openness, humility and simplicity, all qualities that also must be present within a marriage.

The role of the Church is to nurture husbands and wives sacramentally and prayerfully as couples to grow together in mutual love, to assist them as parents in the training of their children in the ways of Christian discipleship, to aid them in the tough times as well as to rejoice with them in the good. There is no nuptial "fairy dust" that is sprinkled on couples. True marriage requires their daily cooperation with the grace of God by ministering the Sacrament to each other for as long as they both shall live, no longer two, but one flesh.

Let us pray, then, for all couples, from newlyweds to golden jubilarians, that they may live the bond of Holy Matrimony in love for one another and so come together into the fullness of life in the Kingdom of God.
