#### From the Pastor's Desk:

#### "When Greatest = Least"

Upon reading the Gospels, one might wonder why Jesus chose the twelve men He did as apostles. Case in point: He had just finished several attempts at teaching them the humble, childlike attitude that He demanded of His disciples and how, with that same attitude, He Himself was about to bring His mission to completion through His passion, death, and resurrection in Jerusalem. It didn't sink in.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, seem to have missed His point. Like people so desirous of the offices near the boss that they'll agree to do anything to get there, as if the cost were no more than playing "Truth or Dare", they proclaim that they even are willing to share in Christ's sufferings to achieve their personal goals of position, power, and prestige. This, in turn, rather reasonably ticks off the other ten, themselves perhaps regretful that they didn't get to ask Jesus first.

I suggest that Christ chose these particular twelve men because, like us, they are so human. They're not impressive superheroes (at least not yet). They don't catch on very quickly; they often don't grasp the basic points that Christ makes, even after He gives them example after example. They're simple men, and (at least eleven of them) are honest men for all their ambitions and lack of understanding.

Christ makes very clear in today's Gospel passage that the price of discipleship is very high: it is the complete giving of oneself to others in humble service, embracing even the ultimate cost of suffering and dying to self for a higher goal.

This theme is presented in the first reading from the Prophet Isaiah, as well. Here we find part of one of the "Suffering Servant" songs. Did it apply to Isaiah himself, or to another prophet, or to the nation as a whole? The Church has always seen in these songs the redemptive sufferings of Christ in humble and loving obedience to the "pleasure", i.e., the will, of the Father that brought about the "ransom of many", as many as would accept His teachings and follow Him.

Christ does not give us a challenge that He knows we cannot accomplish. The second reading today plainly reminds us that, as a human being Himself, He understood very well what it is to be human with weaknesses and limitations. He is, however, the perfect human: tested but never having succumbed to the temptation to sin, i.e., to turn away from the Father in order to "do His own thing".

We forget too often that Jesus Christ is truly, fully human as well as truly, fully divine. This reminder should give us cause for hope and encouragement in our own struggles to follow Him in a hostile world that wants no part of Him, His teachings, or His Church. At the same time, we shouldn't get so comfortable that we fail to act and follow through on the costly requirements of discipleship.

We have grown rather apathetic over the years, but especially in these last twenty-plus months of the pandemic, forced into false comfort zones by situations and powers beyond our control. We see the world as we knew it going mad and falling apart. We frequently forget, though, just Who is in control and we fail to place ourselves into His loving care. Now it is time for us to awaken from our lethargy, to pick up the pieces, and to resume with courage, confidence, and determination our activities as united members of the Body of Christ, the Church.

In the coming months we will be asked to meet and to discuss the current state of the Church and to consider new ways of advancing the mission of Christ in our homes, our parish, our diocese, and, ultimately, in the universal Church. Please be ready to step forward and to participate in this process as fully as you can.

Like all things of this sort, it must begin with self-examination: How well do I know Christ and place myself in His hands? How can I come to know and love Him better? Am I open to His grace and do I put His teachings into practice in my daily life? Am I ready to be the servant of others? Am I willing to become the least in the eyes of the world so as to become the greatest in the mind of Christ?

#### **ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL**

We're *OVER THE TOP* for the <u>2021</u> Annual Catholic Appeal campaign with \$77,378 in pledges received from 170 families against this year's goal of \$76,014. That's 101.8% of goal, thanks to your generosity. How much more can we add to the total? Money over goal that is collected by the end of the year will come back to the Parish for our own local needs.

The goal comes to a fair share donation of about \$120 from each of our 650 families. Almost 500 families have yet to participate. Some can give more, some less, but everyone can give something. Please prayerfully consider making a pleage this year. Forms and envelopes are available in church.

Money raised by this campaign is used to support programs for our elderly and youth, nursing facilities, seminarians and retired priests, and other diocesan and parish pastoral needs.
