

#### From the Pastor's Desk

#### "Putting in Our Two Cents"

"Let me put in my two cents." This is an American expression, derived from a translation of today's Gospel story about the widow's mite. It usually is followed by someone figuratively dumping several dollars worth of their opinion into the conversation. So, allow me to put in my two cents about today's readings.

The point that Jesus is making is that the widow has given fully of herself without holding back anything from God. Having given everything to God, she also places herself into His hands, trusting in His loving care for her. She becomes a model for His disciples to give of themselves in service to God and the Church.

Similarly, the widow of Zarephath trusts in the words of Elijah, the prophet of God, and places herself squarely in the hands of God by using up what she thought to be the last of her food supplies in humble hospitality to the stranger ahead of her own needs and those of her son. Humility and hospitality also are marks of Christian discipleship.

More of a model than these women, though, is Christ Himself, Who gave Himself entirely to the Father in humble obedience to fulfill the divine plan of reconciliation and atonement for the sins of the world. Today's second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that Christ has appeared at the proper time in human history to "take away sin by His sacrifice". His sacrifice is unique, unrepeatable, and not requiring repetition, as did the ancient sacrifices. Every Mass that we offer is not a new sacrifice, but rather a participation in the one sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the Cross for our salvation and that of all the world.

We usually do not emulate fully either of the two women, and certainly not Christ, though we each are called to be generous, to share what we have received from God, Who is never outdone in generosity. It may be a sharing of our time in visiting the sick, or spending it in teaching a child or helping a neighbor, or in some ministry to the Church. It may be a using of our talents, whatever they may be, for helping to build up the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church.

Certainly each of us is called to support the mission of the Church financially to the extent that we can after our own basic needs have been met. We are to be a sacrificial people who place our trust in God's providence and offer back to Him in some relatively small measure what He has given us. Each of us must consider how best to make a return to the Lord for all the good that He has shown us.

Please think about your response in the coming days, and be prepared next week to commit yourself to the financial support of your Parish. In the meanwhile, participate in the meeting this Tuesday at 7:30 PM in the Parish Hall on how the Church's mission can be presented more effectively today.

May the Holy Spirit guide you, Christ strengthen you, and God the Father bless you as you put in your two cents!
