"The King's Good Servants"

Americans remain fascinated by royalty, even though we shook off the rule of the last king of the thirteen seaboard British colonies over 240 years ago. Look at all the fuss we even make over Harry and Megan, who simply want to be "just plain folks". Still, there's something about being ruled by a king that doesn't sit right with us. (We also are not exactly crazy about executive orders and most politicians, but those are other stories for other times and places.) Today's celebration, instituted relatively recently by Church standards, of the solemnity of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe" is one that might puzzle or disturb us. We like Jesus, but all that king stuff is bothersome, foreign, and confusing.

This is the last major feast on the Church's liturgical calendar each year. Next week we will begin a new year with the First Sunday of Advent. As it has approached, we've followed Jesus closer and closer toward the fulfillment of His mission through His passion, death, and resurrection in Jerusalem. We also have reflected during the last couple of weeks on the end of our lives, culminating with our own inevitable death and judgment and the prospects of Heaven, Hell, and Purgatory, with some fearsome scenes having been presented for our consideration along the way.

Today's feast reminds us that Christ's victory was prophesied centuries earlier, that He was in total command of the situation even as He stood before Pilate who would order His execution, and that Christ has conquered sin and death by His own death and resurrection and now rules from Heaven in the glory of God the Father. "Death no longer has power over Him," St. Paul reminded the Christians of the City of Rome. Similarly, we must die to sin and live for God.

There is nothing that the world could throw against Christ that might unseat or defeat Him. That should be a comfort to us who follow Him and acknowledge Him as the Lord and Master of our lives by the way that we put His teachings into effect each day in ways great and small. Christ is not limited by time and space, but He is the focal point of all of human history. We do not follow someone who is here today and gone tomorrow, or who makes promises that he cannot deliver, or some despot who stands aloof while issuing harsh commands to slaves. We are to serve with love the One Who has loved us first and loved us in the extreme. Serving for disciples of Christ is to be life giving, not carried out as a hardship or burden, but done in humble and loving response to the loving initiative of God.

We are united to Christ by Baptism in a bond of divine love that cannot be undone and have become members of His Mystical Body. He has conquered even sin and death and reigns now in Heaven. We share in His victory. God invites us to receive His grace and mercy and the forgiveness of our sins and so come to the fullness of life that He has prepared for us. With that in mind, we join in the ranks of countless disciples.

Let us be the King's good servants, and thereby beloved children of God, Who has placed all things under Christ's feet, giving Him and us the final victory. If we live in Him, we shall reign with Him.
