From the Pastor's Desk:

"Waiting in Fear or Joyful Hope?"

We've heard some fearful messages over the last few weeks telling us about the troubled end times and the return of Christ in glory and majesty to judge the living and the dead. Now in the middle of Advent we turn our attention to the promised coming of the Messiah two thousand years ago. Once again, the central figure in our Gospel reading is St. John the Baptist. While his message remains consistent, i.e., that there is a need for repentance, yet is there a tone of hope about it. Why repent and reform, if there is no hope for forgiveness and a new beginning?

The response of the people to St. John's call for a radical change of mind and heart ("metanoia" in St. Luke's Greek) may be expressed simply as, "Uh-oh! Now what do we do?" His challenge certainly shook them up, and rightly so. Nevertheless, his response to their implorations for direction should not have come as a surprise to them, for the Law and the Prophets had presented the answer to their questions over and over again throughout the centuries. St. John's instructions may be boiled down to these words of the Prophet Micah:

"You have been told, O mortal, what is good, and what the LORD requires of you: only to do justice, to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God." (Micah 6: 8)

Like the people in the time of St. John the Baptist and of every other period in history before or since, we also find it disturbing when someone tells us that we have to change our ways, to put our sins behind us, and to accept the grace of God in order to live a new and fuller life of holiness. Although this holy season of Advent is not looked upon as having the penitential gravity of Lent, its purpose is much the same: to enter into a concentrated period of reform and renewal, not simply to celebrate a particularly solemn feast but rather to prepare to receive the Lord always with openness, faith, hope, love, and joy.

That last attitude, joy, often is misplaced in our preoccupation with the more superficial aspects of these December days. We take momentary joy in the displays of our homes, in the foods that we prepare and share, and in the presents that we're able to give, all things that are here today and gone tomorrow. Meanwhile, we can miss the great reason for our lasting joy: our salvation and redemption in Jesus Christ. It is this joy that should mark our celebration today, the Third Sunday of Advent, as we join with all of Holy Mother Church in echoing the words of St. Paul to his disciples in Philippi: "Rejoice in the Lord always! I say it again: rejoice! The Lord is near."

Our celebration of the Lord's birth is less than two weeks off. We probably will spend the intervening time on the incidentals like shopping and decorating and attending premature Christmas parties. We also need to accept St. John's challenge, however, and to work on achieving the joy that will last: the renewal of our lives by the grace of God by putting our sins behind us through the Sacrament of Reconciliation and living instead a life of holiness, justice, mercy, compassion, charity, and forgiveness. Then truly will we be children of God.

God the Father never gives up on us but has sent us His only-begotten Son for our redemption. Each day He extends to us His love, pardon, and peace and gives us all that we need to answer the Baptist's challenge. That should be the reason not for fear but for joyful hope as we wait and prepare to celebrate Christ's birth in humility and His future coming in glory.
