From the Pastor's Desk:

"Quotable Quotes"

My great-grandmother (my mother's, mother's mother), who lived with us during my formative years, was a woman of great wisdom. She seemed to have a saying for every situation and occasion in life, which always amazed me. It wasn't until I entered the seminary and started formal study of the Scriptures that I realized that many of "her" sayings had come from the Bible. Who would have guessed that this little old Sicilian lady wearing a black dress and a bun was a Scripture scholar? Then again, she was a woman of great faith.

Today's Mass readings present us with several sayings from the Old Testament book of Sirach, St. Paul's first letter to his disciples in Corinth, and those of Christ as recorded by St. Luke in the "Sermon on the Plain". They aren't presented to amaze us or simply to impress us with their pithiness, but rather – as with all of Scripture – that we might reflect upon and learn from them as we try to make some sense of our lives and seek guidance in the way that we interact with others. It comes down to reasoned reflections followed by prudent actions.

This week begins the holy season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. We often use these weeks to kick bad habits, to shed a few unwanted pounds, or to start new exercise regimens, as if we were making New Year's resolutions (which usually get broken by January 3). Moreover, people who haven't seen the inside of a church in a while are quite eager to get *schmutzed* with burnt palm residue as if it were the guarantee to eternal life or, at least, a year of good luck. There often is very little reflection, no less a follow-up with prudent action, involved. (For the record, yes, there are times when I certainly do have a very large wooden beam in my own eye, but this isn't one of them.)

There is much to reflect upon personally in this week's readings that can and should be used in the next few days as our preparation to enter into Lent so that it serves us well in our spiritual development and formation as disciples of Christ. In a similar way, there will be many opportunities to enter into spiritual exercises with both private and communal prayer, participation in the celebration of liturgies, and attempts at abstinence and bodily mortification in the weeks ahead. Our reasoned reflection also should lead us, however, to such prudent actions as performing the corporal and/or spiritual acts of mercy, as well as recognizing our own need for reconciliation with God and one another.

Lent is supposed to be for us a time of radical transformation, to put away the old person and to take on the new person in Christ. We should be different on Holy Saturday night from the person that we are on Ash Wednesday morning. It isn't likely to be a matter of waking up one day and finding ourselves to have been changed but rather one of gradual development with its ups and downs, advances and setbacks. Do not be discouraged if you do not seem to make steady progress or quickly radiate the glow of sanctity. Persist in your determination to grow in your love for Christ and in your openness to receiving and working with His grace.

In the words of St. Paul from today's second reading, "be firm, steadfast, always devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." May this Lent be a time in which we put behind us the old life of sin and strive to take on the new life of grace! May God, Who begins the good work in you, bring it to completion in the Day of our Lord Jesus Christ!

~ BOILER PROJECT UPDATES ~

Expenses for the temporary boiler have passed \$23,000 and are continuing at almost \$4,000/week between equipment rental and fuel oil. The second collections so far total \$4,631* (two weeks) and will need to continue for the foreseeable future. Meanwhile, contractors are appraising the situation to give us replacement estimates.
