From the Pastor's Desk:

"Testifying to the Light"

Have you ever awakened from sleep in the middle of the night and found yourself barely able to make out even familiar surroundings in the darkened room? Everything appears in gray tones as your eyes adjust little by little. Then, you turn on the bedside lamp and your eyes are almost blinded by the light. Again you adjust, and all appears in living color until you turn off the light and it fades back to gray.

I think that this is a reasonable image of what the Apostles experienced during the transfiguration of Christ on the mountain as presented to us in today's Gospel. Some of the ancient Fathers of the Church taught that what the Apostles saw was the divine reality of Christ as He always was in all His glory, though no longer obscured by His humanity. The sight of Him thus presented blew them away.

The presence of Moses and Elijah, representing the Law and the Prophets, testify to Him, and, as if this were not enough to astound them, so, too, do the voice of God the Father and, in the form of a cloud, the Holy Spirit. To be sure, it is a scene worthy of Cecil B. de Mille, yet it is not presented to astound but to reinforce and strengthen His disciples, including us. Jesus is on His way to the fulfillment of the mission that He received from the Father, i.e., the redemption of the world, and He had just told the Twelve that it would be accomplished by His passion, death, and resurrection.

The Transfiguration also presents to us, as it did to the three privileged Apostles that Jesus is the fulfillment of the promises contained in the Hebrew Scriptures and that He is united with the Father in the bond of the Spirit. Salvation history and the Most Holy Trinity are presented through the Person of Jesus Christ. As such, we are instructed, as were the Apostles, to *listen* to Him. Don't just hear what He says, but pay active attention to Him and take His words to heart by acting upon them.

St. Luke tells us that the Apostles "fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen." They would proclaim Christ, but not until after He had completed His mission and ascended to the Father. We are often like them: we may have an encounter with the Holy, but we clam up, perhaps in confusion, perhaps in fear of being ridiculed, perhaps fearfully overwhelmed by a sense of our unworthiness.

Nevertheless, this holy season of Lent is God's invitation to us to enter into the mystery of His love more intensely, to reflect upon what we experience, to take it to heart, and, by doing so, to proclaim our love for Him and our faith in Christ more fully and openly by the way that we live our lives, testifying to the "Light from Light [and] true God from true God," as we profess Him to be in the Creed.

So do not be afraid of the Spirit as He descends on you but heed the voice of the Father calling you to the fullness of life! Accept His grace and persevere in the conversion of heart that He already has begun in you this Lent, following Christ His Son to Jerusalem, to the hillside of Calvary and, eventually, to the empty tomb through which life, your life, has been restored and redeemed.
