From the Pastor's Desk:

"Lent: Stalling Out or Progressing?"

So, how's Lent working out for you? Are you on track and progressing with your initial good intentions, or, as for so many others of us, is it stalling out and slipping away? The distractions of what's going on in the world around us – whether on a small, personal level or on that of the grand scale of world events like the war, or the economy, or the continuing, topsy-turvy pandemic – aren't helping.

Some of us entered Lent with no particular plan in mind, content with just going along wherever the wind might blow and the Spirit lead us. Others of us began with a detailed, hope-filled regimen of spiritual exercises and reading prayers and acts of mercy all planned out. Many of us among the latter group might just as well be numbered among the first set for all the success that we seem to have achieved so far. Like the owner of the fig tree, we even might be tempted to stop our efforts and to kill the program as a waste of time and toil because it's not producing the good fruits for which we had hoped.

Fortunately for us, God doesn't take that drastic action with us any too quickly; He is willing to be patient with us. Moreover, Lent lasts for several weeks and not just for a few days, and Christ is on our side, more than ready, willing, and able to help us through His Spirit to achieve Lent's goals: our reformation and radical change of heart drawing us to the Father. We easily can get sidetracked by our intended means and fail to remember our goal, and so we need to look beyond the distractions, the discouragements, and the setbacks and be prepared to readjust and to start again by the grace of God.

Our first reading today presents Moses in his first encounter with the God of the Patriarchs. It is a costly meeting for Moses as he learns who God is and is given a mission that will require the rest of his life to accomplish: the liberation of the Hebrew people from bondage and their deliverance into the Promised Land. It's also an educational encounter for us as it was for Moses, for we learn that God is the great "I AM", or, as some Scripture scholars have explained, "I am the One Who does for you", i.e., God is purposefully, intentionally, and supportively active in the lives of His people, including us today.

Lent will be as fruitful for us (and for God) as we make it by allowing His grace to work in us and through us. It will require that we answer His call, the call not of just a few weeks, but of a whole lifetime. It will require us to put behind us the sins of our past, recognizing that we are no more innocent and sinless than anyone else and, therefore, just as much in need of God's mercy and forgiveness as the next person. Finally, it will require us to produce the fruit of good works and ongoing conversion of heart that bring us toward holiness and the true and eternal Promised Land of the Father's Kingdom.

God is patient, but our lives in this world are limited. If you're making progress this Lent, "take care not to fall"; don't rest on your laurels in smug self-satisfaction, but continue the good work that God has begun in you. If you've hit a wall already, don't be discouraged, but begin again to accept the grace of God, even if it means taking "baby steps" toward the Goal. Don't stall out, but persevere and progress!
