From the Pastor's Desk:

"Hear His Voice"

Last week, in a very long Gospel passage, we heard Christ tell St. Peter to feed His lambs and sheep and to tend His sheep, that is, to shepherd the early Church given into his care. In a much briefer passage today, on this Good Shepherd Sunday, we find Christ Himself as the great Shepherd of the flock given to Him by the Father. These are His disciples, who hear His voice and follow Him in this temporal life into the eternal life that He bestows upon them, upon us.

Christ's pledge of eternal life is something in which we already share by virtue of the Sacrament of Baptism by which we are joined to Him as members of His Mystical Body, the Church, and through Him, to God the Father, Who holds us tight. It is a life to be held precious yet spent freely in mission, following the example of Christ and the saints down through the ages.

The realized promise of Christ is seen in today's second reading from the vision of St. John as he recorded it in the *Book of Revelation*, aka *The Apocalypse*. Despite the persecutions that they had endured, those who heard the Shepherd's voice and followed Him faithfully have emerged triumphant in the end and participate in the heavenly victory celebration of Christ, the Lamb of God.

St. Luke, remembering the experiences of St. Paul and St. Barnabas, tells us that things did not always go smoothly for them. They met with great opposition at times, great frustrations, and even great threats to life and limb over and over again. Today's first reading is but one of many such instances, as they meet with limited success in the city of Antioch in Pisidia, an area of now western mainland Turkey. Their efforts were not entirely in vain, though, for some 250 years later, a young woman, a descendant of those who did accept Paul's proclamation of salvation in Christ, would give her life in witness to her faith in Him as Lord, God, and Savior. Her name was Margaret, the patroness of our Parish.

Where does that leave us? Christ also has called you and me by name to follow Him and to proclaim our faith in Him with our very lives. We find that call in devout prayer. There are so many noises and distractions in our lives, though, that it often is difficult to hear what Christ has to say, no less to take His teachings and commands to heart and to put them into effect in the varied events of life.

There also are the persecutions that we encounter, whether physical harm and violent opposition or simply indifference. That is when we need all the more to turn to Christ in prayer and in proper reception of the Sacraments, especially Reconciliation and the Eucharist, that He has given us as a means of strengthening the bonds that unite us to Himself and to one another. There is nothing magical about the grace of God. It requires work and cooperation on our part. The ultimate success beyond the trials and tribulations is guaranteed for those who remain faithful. Although the battles may continue, Christ has won the war for us.

Priests, as shepherds who re-present the Person of Christ, Head of the Church, are called to take up the mission of St. Peter to nurture and to guide the flock, the people, given into our pastoral keeping. Sadly, we do not always do that. Sometimes we are silent when we should speak out on matters of morals and the Natural Law as well as on the Church's Faith. We should challenge, but fall into playing the numbers game all too easily and are hesitant, if not afraid, to ruffle the wrong feathers. Even worse, some consciously mislead people by their false teachings and/or misdeeds.

Pray for all priests, that we may be faithful in carrying out the mission given to us through ordination: the salvation of souls in Christ. May we receive the Word of God honestly with open hearts and minds, truly believe what we read, boldly proclaim and teach what we believe, and lovingly practice what we teach!

May Christ grant us all the grace to hear His voice and to follow Him!

BOILER PROJECT UPDATES

Thank you for your on-going generosity in the second collection, which has helped to offset the expenses of renting and operating the temporary boiler at over \$5,000/week. The unit has been removed, since the weather warmed up sufficiently; the second collection will continue for a few more weeks to offset the backlog of bills.

Estimates for removing and replacing the old boilers are running in excess of \$450,000. Substantial financing and fundraising will be required.
