From the Pastor's Desk:

"Have You Tried It Yet?"

This morning (Tuesday), I had the pleasure of celebrating Mass with the First Communion class from our Academy who had come to offer their thanksgiving and also to help crown a statue of our Lady. I asked them if they were still excited about having received the Eucharist last Saturday. To a child, their faces lit up with big smiles as they nodded "Yes". Turning to the adults in the congregation, I remarked as to how that should be our response every time we receive the Lord. It isn't easy. We don't always embrace the Kingdom of God as a little child. The novelty does wear off after a while, and more's the pity for that.

Similarly, our desire to follow Christ's commandment to "love one another" as He has loved us also seems to falter rather easily. The British author G.K. Chesterton, one of the greatest writers of the last century and a convert to Catholicism, commented to the effect that "Christianity hasn't been tried and found wanting; it just hasn't been tried," by which I suspect he meant that we disciples really haven't given ourselves over entirely to the Master's great commandment. There are so many obstacles to our doing so, many of our own choosing or device. Besides, loving other people would be a lot easier if it weren't for other people.

The counsel to persevere in the practice of the Faith that St. Paul gave his congregation in today's first reading applies equally to us. At times, following his itinerary can be like playing "Where's Waldo?" We might imagine that Paul and Barnabas met with one success after another, but a good reading of the Acts of the Apostles would enlighten us as to the reality of their ups and downs. Two towns before the opening of today's reading, for instance, found Paul and Barnabas at the point of death, having been stoned – with real stones – for having preached openly and without apology or mincing of words that Jesus was the promised Messiah.

Our standing up for the teachings of Christ and His Church probably won't result in someone chucking a rock at us (though one can never tell these days), but we Christians, especially Catholics who are such in more than name only, will run into great opposition. "It is necessary for us," too, "to undergo many hardships in order to enter the Kingdom of God." Just open a newspaper or turn on the evening news. Some of our opponents seem to be evil personified, especially those who grasp for political power all too eager to stand on the corpses of millions of murdered children. What really drives the opposition nuts, though, is not our responding in kind with violence and mockery and scornful diatribes and bombast, but our responding in the way that we have been taught by Christ, namely, "love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you."

St. John the Beloved Disciple saw in his vision a new Heaven and a new earth, the new Jerusalem descending from Heaven as the presence of the living God among His people after they had suffered many trials and tribulations for their faithfulness. That certainly will happen at the end of time, but it also can be part of our experience even now as we try to take to heart and practice the teachings of Christ and His Church, following the instructions and examples of the honored saints as well as of the good people whom we ourselves have known.

There is great joy and newness of life to be found when we do enter into the love of God and share it with others. It shouldn't take an "I'm a Christian" T-shirt or bumper sticker for people to recognize us as Christ's disciples. Instead, let us persevere in our love for one another. Have you tried it yet? Have I?

BOILER PROJECT UPDATES

Thank you for your generosity in the second collection, which has helped to offset the expenses of renting and operating the temporary boiler at over \$5,000/week. Although the unit has been removed, we need to continue the second collection for a few more weeks to offset the open billings.

Estimates for removing and replacing the old boilers are running in excess of \$450,000. We hope to begin work once the school year has ended. Substantial financing and fundraising will be required.
