

#### From the Pastor's Desk:

### "Determined Disciples in Mission"

Last week, we heard Christ demand total commitment from His disciples. Today's Scriptures present some other characteristics of discipleship, in particular, trust, perseverance, and joy.

Following Christ doesn't always lead to success in the mission in which we share, namely, to bring people to Christ and, through Him, to God the Father. The world into which we proclaim the Gospel – first and foremost by the way that we live the teachings of Christ – often is hostile to the Christian message. Christ makes it clear to His missionaries from the start that their proclamation may not be welcome always and everywhere. Sometimes the response will be apathy; at other times they will be shown outright hostility. History, including our own times, has borne this out. Still, we are to trust in the abiding presence and providence of God as we persevere in our endeavors to further His Kingdom.

For many people, the "Good News" is bad news that calls them, as it does each and every person, to a new way of life based on humble, loving service to one another. This involves a dying to self, to egocentrism, to licentiousness and our own wants and desires. Instead, we seek to achieve a higher good, which is eternal life with God, Who is the Supreme Good. So it is that St. Paul could tell his congregations in Galatia (parts of modern Turkey) that he had found his prize in the Cross of Christ, through which the world and its values had been crucified to him and he had been crucified to them. The only thing that mattered to him was his relationship with Jesus Christ. They, too, could find their life and their joy, only if they were willing to stake it all on following not Paul, but Christ.

Almost twenty centuries later, you and I are called to follow the Master and to proclaim His message of love, repentance, reformation, and reconciliation. As with those who have done so before us, we need to have faith and trust in God in order to persevere against a hostile world and to do it all with joy, the joy of a child sitting with comforting assurance on his/her mother's lap. Neither the task nor the road is easy, but Christ walks every step of the way with us, strengthening us with the grace of His Spirit and His Sacraments and encouraging us by His Word and the examples of the "great cloud of witnesses", who have gone before us.

In closing, I'd like to share again a thought on the observance this weekend of our country's 246<sup>th</sup> anniversary as an independent nation. The words are taken not from Scripture but from our founding civil document, the Declaration of Independence. They remain important and apropos, for we live in a time of great division and confusion in our country as many continue to try to erase what we have cherished and to destroy what unites us as one nation under God. We must return to our roots, secular as well as religious, in order to be a people who strive to achieve the common good.

"We hold these Truths to be self-evident: that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness....

"And for the Support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the Protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

The challenges to our being good disciples of Christ and good Americans are many. With firm reliance, then, on God's love for us, let us recommit ourselves to taking up our crosses in following Christ more faithfully and cheerfully each day. Let us also rededicate ourselves to the noble ideals of our nation's Founders, who dared to dream of a better world and entrusted themselves to God.

May God bless you, and may God bless America!
