From the Pastor's Desk:

"The Better Part"

These last few weeks we've been looking at characteristics that Christians are supposed to have as good disciples, from commitment, to trust, perseverance, and joy a few weeks ago to mercy and compassion last week. We continue this week with two more, namely, hospitality and attentiveness to the Word of God.

The beautiful icon written by St. Andrei Rublev in early XV Century Russia wonderfully illustrates the scene presented in today's first reading, with Abraham giving hospitality to three strangers, unaware that they were really the living God. Hospitality, especially toward strangers, was and remains a strong trait in the culture of the Middle East and many other societies, as well. It goes beyond simple courtesy. Whatever one has is shared freely and generously with others. I have experienced it myself many times in visits to faith-filled friends, now "cousins" by mutual albeit informal "adoption", in Herzegovina as they emulate the hospitality and the deep faith of Abraham and Sarah.

"Table fellowship" is important for us, too, as Catholics today. We gather around the altar of the Lord, following the pattern of Christ's Last Supper with His Apostles. It is the ultimate expression of our faith in which we share all that Christ has to give – His very self in Word and in Sacrament. Unlike the scene with Abraham, though, it is not a matter of "all are welcome" as the modern hymn would have it. First we must hold to a right and common Faith and a common practice, which enable us to share properly in the common sacrificial offering; i.e., our unity of belief and way of life is a prerequisite for true sacramental communion.

Today's Gospel presents us with yet another image of hospitality, though one that is relegated to a second place of importance. Jesus had come to the home of His friends Lazarus, Martha, and Mary as a dinner guest, a role He often enjoyed. As Martha ran around trying to prepare the meal to make sure that everything was in order, her sister Mary, contrary to the custom of the time, sat at the feet of Christ like one of His male disciples, listening to Him speak. Perhaps we've been in a similar situation, where one person is scrambling to present a meal while someone else in the family just sits around engaging in conversation. Small wonder that Martha was upset. But Christ told her that there is a "better part" that Mary had chosen, something even more important than showing hospitality, and that was to hearing and being open to the Word of God, which, in turn, should motivate the listener and provide the reason and support for living as His disciple.

St. Paul was adamant about breaking open the Word for his disciples, too, not only in the city of Colossae, but wherever he preached about Jesus. For him, of course, it was a matter of interpreting the Hebrew Scriptures, what we call the Old Testament, since the Christian Scriptures, the New, including his own letters, were still in the process of being written. Nevertheless, the proclamation of the Good News of our salvation in Christ was done in terms of the fulfillment of the ancient promises and led Paul to follow Christ, uniting himself even with His sufferings.

How attuned are we to the Word of God? How familiar are we with the Scriptures? Do we enter the Liturgy of the Word cold, or do we prep for it by reading the Scriptures before Mass or at home? Is the homily the only time that we reflect on the Word of God, or is Scripture study, including prayerful reflection, an integral part of our spiritual life? When was the last time that the family Bible was opened and read and shared with others in the family, presuming that we have a copy of the Bible at home?

The quotation from St. Jerome that appears on page 3 of the *Mass Bells* every week at the bottom of the list of daily readings is a reminder to us to ground ourselves in the Word of God, which gives us impetus and guides us to act properly in our relationships with God and those around us. It's not a matter of either/or. Rather, we are able to serve God and neighbor better because we are grounded firmly in His Word, having chosen first the "better part".
