From the Pastor's Desk:

"Don't Be Surprised"

Do you like surprises? I must confess, that I am not terribly fond of them, having experienced a few too many unpleasant ones, both physical and fiscal, in the course of the last five and a half years as pastor here at St. Margaret's. Pope Francis keeps saying, "Our God is a God of surprises". I just wish that the Lord wouldn't live up to that designation quite so often.

The children of Israel weren't entirely certain about how God was going to bring about their freedom from bondage in Egypt, but, according to today's first reading from the Book of Wisdom, they at least got a heads-up through Moses and faithfully prepared for whatever it was that the LORD God was going to do to keep His promise. The people braced themselves and followed God's instructions, He acted, and the rest, as the saying goes, is history. Surprises can be good, after all.

Abraham was surprised several times in the course of his dealings with God, from his initial encounter with three mysterious guests that we read about a few weeks ago, to the miraculous conception of his son Isaac, to the equally miraculous sparing of Isaac's life, as noted in the longer form of today's second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews. Faith, "the realization of what is hoped for and the evidence of things not seen", was at play over and over again in dealing with the surprises, enabling Abraham to persevere in following God's instructions.

The central part of today's Gospel passage also speaks to us about faith and surprises. You may be familiar with it, if you've attended a wake service recently. Only Jesus could get away with comparing Himself to a thief coming in the night. He was telling His disciples to be prepared for His return at the end of time. They were to be on guard constantly, ready to receive Him, though they knew neither the day nor the hour. He was speaking about His Second Coming, to which we refer when we profess the Creed. Although He spoke about signs that would tip off His return, almost twenty centuries have come and gone, along with generations of disciples, and we're still waiting. So, how are we supposed to be prepared?

More immediately and personally, I think He was also telling them/us to be prepared to receive Him when He should come at the end of our individual time, for which, also, we know neither the day nor the hour. We are to be prepared every moment of our lives to open to the Lord when He comes and knocks.

This doesn't mean that we seal ourselves off in our bedrooms or some dank cave, Rosary in one hand and Bible in the other, waiting for Jesus to show up. Rather it requires that we live each day faithfully according to His teachings, keeping God at the center of our lives. Every act of mercy and forgiveness, of goodness and compassion, of justice and self-sacrifice that we perform is a living out of our faith in Him Who has promised us the eternal life for which we hope.

Christianity is not simply a matter of doctrines and dogmas, rules and regulations that we choose to accept or dismiss. These, along with Sacred Scripture and the Sacraments, are given to us by God through His Church to assist us in strengthening our relationship with Christ. The good that we do, and our avoidance of sin, are not supposed to be isolated incidents in our lives but should be integral expressions of who we are as members of the Body of Christ, joined to Him and, through Him, to the Father and the Holy Spirit by the waters of Baptism.

When we live consistently in such a manner, it doesn't matter when the Lord comes to take us home. Whenever that occurs, He will not catch us off guard. One day or another, the Son of Man will come. Live, then, as He has instructed you to do, vigilantly in faith. Then don't be surprised at the result!
