From the Pastor's Desk:

"It's Not Just Who You Know"

The first impression that I got from today's first reading reminded me of one of the hymns on my "Do NOT Sing" list, the one with the lyrics, "All are welcome in this place." The vision of the prophet (at a time towards the end of, if not right after, the Babylonian Exile, late VI Century B.C.) envisions gentiles, people from every land, coming to worship God and to offer sacrifices to Him in Jerusalem. People who were not of the priestly tribe of Levi would present their own offerings. Although they would rejoice over the prospect of the restoration of their exiled nation, the second part of the vision cannot have made the Israelites very happy. After all, were they not the Chosen People, the ones chosen from all others from the time of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob to be in a special, exclusive relationship with God by covenant? Had not they alone received the Word of God through Moses and so many prophets?

The Gospel seems to me to support the first reading, but it also goes further in the way of clarification. Again, the attitude among Christ's listeners was in keeping with the same mindset that their ancestors six centuries removed had. They were the Chosen People, the ones to whom the Messiah would be sent. Certainly, they would have the "inside track" in the matter of salvation, the chosen few, as it were. Jesus' response to the question about how many will be saved confirms that, although the invitation to redemption and salvation is universal, the actual number saved will be relatively low. "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough to do so."

The reason for the relatively small number and surprising listing of attendees is not because of arbitrary exclusivity on the part of God but rather because of the lack of response among those who first received the invitation. That still stands. What held true for the people of Christ's time holds equally true for us Christians today. God invites; many do not respond properly.

The Protestant reformers of the XVI Century declared that professing belief in Jesus Christ as one's Lord, God, and Savior was enough. Some of their successors still do today. It might be a happy and convenient thought, but it ignores the Letter of James, Matthew 25:31-46, and many other passages of Sacred Scripture. Nevertheless, there is no salvation except through Jesus Christ. No one come to the Father except through Him.

Baptism is a start, not a free pass into Heaven. Many people claim to be Christians, members of the Mystical Body of Christ by Baptism, but "knowing" Him must be more than simply a matter of acknowledging facts. Christianity is a way of life. The call to holiness extends to all people, but it should be clear from Christ's answer that every invitee is expected to respond to God's invitation by repenting and turning away from sin, and living instead a life of contrition, holiness, mercy, justice, forgiveness, and compassion; i.e., not only knowing that the Word of God exists, but also taking it to heart and putting it into effect in one's daily life.

Christ calls us into a fuller life in intimate relationship with Himself. His Word and His Sacraments are tools that He has given to His Church to assist us in our response. Do we really experience Him in our lives? Is He truly at our center, the guiding force in our daily grind, or do we just "eat and drink" with Him and listen to Him teach for less than an hour a weekend when we grudgingly spare Him the time? Do we count ourselves among those who will sit at the eternal Banquet Feast of the Lamb in the company of the patriarchs and prophets and countless others (see the Book of Revelation)? Why, or why not?

Live each day, then, as a true disciple of Christ. Hear His Word, take it to heart, and act upon it. After all, in the end, it's not just Who you know that counts, but what you do.
