From the Pastor's Desk:

"A God Who Seeks and Saves"

It isn't often that we get not just one or two, but three parables from Christ as He tries to make a point. Today's Gospel passage presents Him in the presence of a mixed crowd: recognized traitors and sinners on the one hand and righteous (or rather, self-righteous) people on the other. The common, sharp point that he drives home is directed toward the former as a sign of hope and toward the latter as a reminder of the merciful love of God that exceeds His justice.

Oddly enough, the setting of the first parable seems to be irrational. Who in their right mind would leave ninety-nine sheep alone in the wilderness and set off in search of one wayward sheep? Let it go; stay to protect the ninety-nine! Yet, the shepherd (God) is willing to go out of his way in order to reclaim the lost one. What might appear to be madness to us is the measure to which God is willing to go not only to get sinners (i.e., you and me) back to safety but also to do so tenderly and without chastisement. *Game* for the Kingdom!

The second parable makes little more sense than the first. How many times have we misplaced something and simply chalked it up as being lost? It's often no big deal and no great loss; it won't be missed all that much. Yet, God <u>does</u> make a big deal about figuratively turning His house upside down until He finds what was lost (again, you and me). We are not of negligible value in the eyes of God. In His mind and heart, we are very much worth seeking out and rejoicing over when we are found, even if it means going out of His way. *Set* for the Kingdom!

Finally, we have the much-loved parable of "The Prodigal Son". "Prodigal" means *exceedingly wasteful*. The younger son wasted whatever inheritance he had demanded of and received from his father. One might think that he also had wasted his father's good will and patience and love, but not so. For the father himself was rather loose (one might say prodigal), showering his patience and his love on the wayward son to the point of not simply waiting for the young man to return home and to his senses, hat in hand, but even anxiously looking out for the son's return and then restoring him to full rank and privilege. That, too, is our God, Who does not write us off as lost before going about His business elsewhere, but Who anxiously looks for us and reclaims us as His own beloved children with all the rights and privileges pertinent thereto. He gives us what we ourselves are too often embarrassed to ask for – His pardon and His forgiveness – and the means to acquire it in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. *Match* for the Kingdom!

Salvation history is marked over and over and over again by people who have tried God's patience, rejected His love, ignored His Commandments, and threatened His Covenant. Yet, over and over and over again, God has sought out and restored these very same people to proper relationship with Himself. A notable example is St. Paul, who is rather open and direct in today's epistle, admitting his failures and rejoicing in the mercy that was shown him by God through Christ.

The Scriptures have been given to us by God as a record of the ups and downs of human relationships with Him and of His repeated acts of love and mercy that exceed His justice. How well do we see ourselves in the stories presented to us in today's readings? Perhaps we need to look a bit more closely and carefully, for we all are there, you and I, brothers and sisters, whether we are among the unfaithful Israelites, or the lost sheep/coin, or the wasteful son, or the indignant son, or the recognized sinners, or the self-righteous listeners, or the sinful persecutor-turned-apostle. We are all there.

Fortunately for us, God doesn't give up on us but goes out of His way to redeem us, to the point of sending His only-begotten Son to suffer and die for our sins and to raise us to new life. For, indeed, we have a God Who seeks and saves what is lost.

BOILER PROJECT UPDATE

Two new gas-fueled, steam-generating boilers have been installed in the main building, the final phase of the project.

The cost of the project is estimated at over \$480,000. We have received a *loan* from the Diocese for \$350,000, which must be repaid over the next few years. Other money will come from our Generations of Faith account and dwindling Parish reserves, but a capital campaign will be needed. More information on this will follow shortly.
