

#### From the Pastor's Desk:

### "Pride and Humility"

"Pride goes before destruction and a haughty spirit before a fall." Most of us are familiar with some version of this expression (Proverbs 16:18) about the problem of false pride. We also probably know someone who is so full of themselves that, if egocentrism could be measured out in dollars and cents, would be a very wealthy person.

There also is the person who bows and grovels in the presence of others but in reality is just as self-centered and self-serving as the braggart. It's almost as if to say, "Look at me! I'm so proud to be so officially lowly and humble." Such is the prayer of our Pharisee friend in today's Gospel passage. There is a fine line, between false pride and false humility.

There may be, on the other hand, justifiable reason for pride: for example a person may take rightful pride in using to the best of his/her ability the talents, time, and treasure that God has bestowed, recognizing that what is accomplished is done by the grace of God, and that these are gifts from Him to be returned to Him by their proper usage in service to Him and neighbor. That is part of the fine line where just pride and just humility meet.

There also is the matter of proper humility, i.e., sincere humility without the PR. We recognize our brokenness and weaknesses, that we are nothing without God, and trust in His power to redeem us and make us whole. Such is the case of the lowly ones in the first reading from the Book of Sirach. That's also the prayer of our other friend, the tax collector, whose attitude and sincerity in prayer merit Christ's approval.

Notice that the Lord does not take exception to the Pharisee's piety – his fasting and tithing – but to his attitude of inflated superiority over other people whom he (the Pharisee) judges to be inferior to himself. In Sicilian, we call that attitude "la superba" – unjustly looking down on others. We probably know a few Pharisee types in our own lives, people whom we'd be rather happy to live without. If you agree with the statement that I just made, perhaps it's time for both of us to reconsider our own attitudes towards other people and towards God.

In today's epistle, taken from one of St. Paul's last letters, we find the Apostle admitting his brokenness as he finds himself exhausted, abandoned, and in prison for his efforts to proclaim the Gospel. Despite the sadness of his situation, Paul can look with both justifiable pride and sincere humility at the reasons for his present state of affairs. He proudly notes that he had accepted the divine challenge to evangelize and used the grace of God fully to accomplish the mission assigned to him; now his eternal reward awaited him. He also humbly acknowledged that all that he had been able to do was done by the grace of the God Who had stood by him at every turn, and Who even in prison was with him through his sufferings.

Like St. Paul, you and I have been called by God to proclaim the Gospel by word and example. We are given every grace needed to accomplish our mission: to bring others and ourselves into the fullness of eternal life and, thereby, to receive "the crown of righteousness that awaits" us. In the process we also must recognize humbly our dependence upon Him and, proudly, His great love for us in making us His children by adoption in Christ. Our lowly prayers will be heard when we respond freely and faithfully to the will of God, and we, too, will be justified. Pride and humility both are at play in our lives. With what attitude will we display them?

#### **BOILER PROJECT UPDATE**

One new gas-fueled, steam-generating boiler has been installed in the main building, and a second is on the way as the final phase of the project. We are waiting for the work to be inspected before being able to turn the heat on for the school and church.

The cost of the project is estimated at over \$480,000. We have received a **loan** from the Diocese of \$350,000, which must be repaid over the next few years via a capital campaign. The balance to pay the outstanding bills will come from our Generations of Faith account and dwindling Parish reserves.
