#### From the Pastor's Desk:

#### "Prayerful Reflection"

We usually think of Christmas as being just one day in the long year. Although we run around for weeks to prepare for it and pull out all the stops to celebrate it, very often we're thankful that Christmas Day has come and gone at last (along with the dinner guests whom we had over to the house). Our liturgical observance of this feast is a different matter, though, as we continue to celebrate it for at least twelve days, each day telling part of the story about the birth of our Savior.

The Gospel of each of the major feasts and solemnities within the Christmas season presents a different scene of witnessing to the reality of the Child. Thus we have the testimony of the angels in one event, that of the shepherds (today's reading) in another, that of the Magi in yet another, the testimony of a holy man and woman in the Temple at the time of His presentation, and, finally, that of God the Father and the Holy Spirit at His baptism. Each of these occasions offers us an opportunity not only to celebrate but also to reflect prayerfully about a key tenet of our faith: the Incarnation of the second Person of the Most Holy Trinity, the only-begotten Son of the Father.

Today, we celebrate the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. It's a feast that gets many non-Catholic and non-Orthodox Christians (not to mention non-Christians) all bent out of shape. How can Mary be the mother of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? How can God, Who existed before all time, have a human mother, who was born in time? The title, however, which was confirmed at the Third Ecumenical Council at Ephesus in 431, speaks more about the Child than about the mother: the Child born of the Virgin Mary, the Council Fathers professed, is true God and true man, fully divine and fully human; therefore Mary rightly can be called "Mother of God". It's a title worthy of our prayerful reflection.

We read in today's Gospel passage that Mary pondered/reflected in her heart on the shepherds' adoration of her Child. It's not the only time that the Gospels say that she did this. One can only imagine how many times Mary must have taken events to heart from the moment of the Annunciation to the day of Christ's Ascension and even beyond. She stands as His model disciple, solid in her faithful relationship with God, attuned to His Word, grasping His will, reflecting on it, accepting it trustingly, and putting it into effect in her life with loving obedience. Mary is what we're supposed to be as children of God by adoption and members of the Mystical Body of Christ by virtue of our baptism. She is the perfect follower of her Son, following the pattern of His own relationship with God the Father.

Mary also is our mother, given by the crucified Christ to His beloved disciple John and through him to all disciples for all times. That includes you and me. Thus, we rightly turn to her in our needs and our difficulties and celebrate our joys with her, just as we would turn to our natural mothers. We ask her intercession with Christ, her Son, for the forgiveness of our sins, the grace of conversion of heart, and protection from harm. We have in her a tender and understanding confidant, and join with her in our prayers to and praise of God. She is a true gift given to the Church as a whole and to each of its members, her children in the Faith.

It is with abiding faith, then, that we can pray: Holy Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, pray for us sinners who have recourse to you! This, too, is worthy of our prayerful reflection.

#### **BOILER PROJECT UPDATE**

The heat finally is on in the main building; the *second* new boiler has been installed and is up and running.

The cost of the project is estimated at over \$480,000. We have received a **loan** from the Diocese of \$350,000, which must be repaid over the next few years. Other money will come from our *Generations of Faith* account and dwindling Parish reserves, but a capital campaign will be needed. More information on this will follow shortly.


