From the Pastor's Desk:

"The Christmas Celebration Continues"

This weekend, we in the USA observe the solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord, which most of the Church celebrated last Friday on the traditional date of January 6. "Epiphany" comes from a Greek word meaning "a manifestation, or showing forth". In this case, the Messiah is presented to gentiles, represented by the Magi, or "Wise Men", as we commonly call them.

Who and how many these strangers were and where they came from are not detailed in Scripture (St. Matthew is the only evangelist to refer to them), but Tradition numbers them as three because of the gifts that they presented (gold, frankincense, and myrrh), names them Gaspar, Balthazar, and Melchior, calls them kings, and holds that they came from the three continents known to the Mediterranean peoples at that time: Asia, Africa, and Europe.

Gold was offered to the Newborn as King of kings and Lord of lords. Frankincense was presented because this Child is true God and true man. Finally, myrrh, which was used in ancient times to embalm bodies, was given as a reminder that Christ came into the world to die for the sins of all mankind in order to redeem us and to reconcile humanity with God.

The great importance of the story lies not with the gifts or the names of the Magi but in that the promise of salvation has been fulfilled not only for the Children of Israel but also for all Gentiles through Jesus Christ, the newborn King of the Jews, Who was rejected by the religious and civil leaders at His birth as well as at His Passion. They should have known better, for there were many prophecies down through the centuries of salvation history. We, too, should recognize Him as the promised Messiah.

Today should be a day of great rejoicing for people of every race and nation, for we have been shown the love and mercy of God. Do we recognize the presence of God in our own lives? If so, how? If not, we should reflect more carefully, for truly God is with us. Do we manifest the presence of Christ to others by the way that we live as His good and faithful disciples? If not, then let us begin to do so, for every day that God gives us is a new opportunity to turn to the Lord and, by following Christ more faithfully, to draw people to Him and to God the Father.

May we come to know Christ Jesus better during this new year, and may the Lord grant you and yours every grace and blessing in the days ahead!
