From the Pastor's Desk:

"One More Witness"

Our crèche will remain in place until February 2, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, but the Christmas Season is officially behind us, and with it the solemnity of the Epiphany and the feast of the Baptism of our Lord. Nevertheless, Holy Mother Church offers us in today's liturgy the testimony of not just one but two more witnesses as to the reality of the Person of Jesus of Nazareth.

The first reading prepares us for God's fulfillment of ancient promises in the person of St. John the Baptist, the last of the prophets and the one who at long last would announce the Messiah's coming. The Gospel passage, on the other hand, presents him in the position of being a secondary, though critically integral, character in the story of salvation. John admitted his own unworthiness. Then, carrying out his role as "Prophet of the Most High", he testified not only to Jesus as the "Lamb of God" and ultimately as the Son of God but also to the confirming presence of the Holy Spirit, Who rested upon Jesus in the form of a dove as He came up from the waters of the River Jordan after His baptism by John.

Aside from its usage at Mass just before Communion time, most people today neither are familiar with the term nor grasp the importance of the designation of the "Lamb of God". It refers to the lamb sacrificed as a sin offering on the altar of the great Temple in Jerusalem in accord with the Law of Moses, particularly at the Passover feast that recounted the liberation of the People of Israel from bondage in Egypt. First Century Jews understood exactly what John was driving at in applying the term to Jesus. True God and true man, Jesus is *the* offering *par excellence*, the only true and perfect sacrifice that has the power and ability to take away the sins of the world, to liberate mankind from its bondage to sin, and to reconcile us to God. Upon hearing John's proclamation, two of his disciples sought out Jesus in order to get to know Him first-hand. They, too, would bear witness about Him to others, initially back home and eventually wherever He sent them in mission.

John's baptism was not the Sacrament of the Church that we receive. Rather, it was a sort of purification, a ritual bathing as a sign of a person's intention to repent of his/her sins and to reform his/her life. One might wonder, then, what business Jesus, the sinless Son of the Father, had in getting baptized, since He had neither any sins of which to repent nor any need to reform His life in order to bring it into right relationship with God the Father.

The event can stand for us as a lesson in humility provided by Jesus and St. John who both bowed to the Divine plan of the Father – Jesus, submitting Himself to the ministrations of His inferior by undergoing the show of the (unnecessary) ritual cleansing, and John, humbly stepping out of the spotlight in order to carry out his own mission to announce One mightier than he, Who had existed before him. Furthermore, it is an indication of the way given by Christ to all who would follow Him as His disciples by setting up the development for our Christian sacramental Baptism through which we truly are cleansed of sin and united with Christ as members of His Mystical Body, the Church. Finally, the scene is a reminder to us that we, too, are to be attuned to the presence of Christ in our lives, to submit ourselves to Him in humility, and to go forth in testifying to our faith in Him by the way that we live our lives according to His teachings.

May the grace and peace of God the Father and the power of His Holy Spirit strengthen you to live more fully and courageously as a disciple of Christ, thereby presenting to a broken and sin-filled world one more witness to the loving mercy of God and the reality of the Lamb of God, His Son, Jesus Christ!
