"Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ" ~ St. Jerome

From the Pastor's Desk:

"Be Perfect Just as Your Heavenly Father Is Perfect"

If you thought last week's Scriptures were difficult to carry out with Christ's command to go beyond the mere letter of the Mosaic Law, this week's readings present even greater challenges. In the passage from Leviticus, Moses delivers God's command to the People of Israel to "be holy, for I, the LORD, your God, am holy!" If that's not problematic enough, Jesus continues His call in His sermon on the mount to surpass what would be normal responses and instead, to "be perfect, just as your Heavenly Father is perfect!"

These commands are going to require a lot of work on our part. We are frail and imperfect, sinners who are prone to use the expression "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" as justification for seeking vengeance, the very thing that that expression was intended to rein in. I paraphrase one of my favorite dramatic characters, Tevye from "Fiddler on the Roof", who responds to another character's impassioned plea to such action against the Tsar's oppressive authorities, "Wonderful! And when we're all blind and toothless, then what do we do?"

We forget sometimes that the Scriptures call us into a life of radical action that is in opposition to the culture around us. Our sinful brokenness would have us act as the world acts: in a manner very much contrary to our calling as children of the God in Whose image and likeness we were created, and as members by Baptism of the Mystical Body of Christ, Whose Name we bear. "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." This doesn't mean that we lie down and play dead and let people walk all over us, nor that we do not stand up for what is right.

Jesus' instructions applied most proximately toward how His followers should behave with respect to the Romans, who were looked upon as evil enemy occupiers. Slapping on the right cheek required most offenders to use the back of the right hand, adding insult to injury. Turning the cheek is to say, "You struck me once, but you will not do that again." Jesus' comment about giving up one's cloak as well as one's tunic points to His own action as the soldiers gambled for His clothing as He hung upon the Cross. Roman soldiers could force non-citizens to carry heavy loads for them for up to a mile. Jesus says to show them that the oppressed are better than the oppressors by going a second mile voluntarily.

The clincher in today's Gospel passage, however, is the final line: "Be perfect, just as your Heavenly Father is perfect!" God is, in fact, the fullness of perfection and of all virtues. We realize that we are very far, indeed, from being perfect. Yet, the Christian is a work in progress. Hopefully, we always are becoming more and more the person whom God has created us to be until we attain Heaven.

Our responses to the often-difficult and even oppressive situations of daily life always require an acceptance of the grace that God pours forth upon us when we ask Him for it. Without God we can do nothing, but with Him we can do all that He commands. The holy season of Lent, which begins this Wednesday, is an opportune time for us to take stock of our lives in order to see where we are in our journey to the Father and what we need to do to alter course in order to live up to His expectations. The sacrifices and acts of charity and additional time spent in prayer are not the goals of Lent, but they are all useful tools, as are frequent reception of the Sacraments and our study of Scripture, to help us achieve the goal of eternal life in union with the Most Holy Trinity.

So, let us strive to be holy as God is holy, to be merciful as God is merciful, to be generous as God is generous, to be faithful as God is faithful, to be patient as God is patient, to be forgiving as God is forgiving, to be loving as God is loving. In short, "be perfect just as your Heavenly Father is perfect!"


