From the Pastor's Desk:

"Don't Just Hear, Listen!"

Like many other languages, English has two distinct verbs for our reception of sound: to hear and to listen. They seem related, maybe even the same, but there is a big difference between the two. The first is passive; the second requires action. Very often the sounds around us simply become "white noise".

Go into any department store and you are bound to hear "seasonal music" being played to relax shoppers and put us in the mood to look at and buy merchandise. Perhaps, we have music playing at our place of business, so softly that we barely notice that it's there all day while we do our work. We play music or put on the TV or radio while we're going about our daily chores or studies. We barely are cognizant of the sounds' presence, but they're there in the background.

Listening, on the other hand, requires effort on the part of the recipient to pay attention to the sound, whether it's music or speech or the weird noises coming from under the hood of our car. The doctor uses a stethoscope to listen to our breathing and heartbeats, which are perfectly audible as far as making sounds is concerned, but require concentration to perceive and evaluate the situation.

The Scriptures today speak to us about listening as paying attention, i.e., of carrying out a command. Abraham not only hears the word of God but also trusts Him to the point of going "as the LORD directed him", leaving everything behind – home, family, property, security, and familiarity – striking out for an unknown place that God would show to him. His reward would be an intimate relationship with this previously unknown god and descendants without number through whom all the nations of the earth would be blessed. From this one man of trusting obedience would come forth the promised Messiah and Savior of the world.

We also find the directive to listen in today's Gospel in the story of the transfiguration/transformation of Christ in front of His three startled disciples. The scene shows them both the reality of Christ's being true God as well as true man, as attested to by Moses (representing the Law) and Elijah (representing the Prophets), and a preview reassurance that this journey to Jerusalem would not end in disaster but in Christ's glorious victory. The Father's words are a repetition of those that He spoke at the time of Christ's baptism in the Jordan at the start of His public life; now they are joined with the Father's command, "Listen to Him!" Get busy about the work of salvation, beginning with yourselves.

I've often paired this command to that of our Lady to the waiters at the wedding feast of Cana: "Do whatever He tells you!" Both Christ's divine Father and human mother tell us the same thing: that we should pay attention to Him. This holy season of Lent is a time for us to try once again to carry out His teachings, to change what needs to be changed in our lives in order to follow Christ more faithfully.

This requires us to listen to Him speaking to us in the context of deeper prayer and careful reflection on the Scriptures, taking what He says to heart; to respond to our having been called by the grace of God to be "saints among the saints in the halls of Heaven" (cf. today's letter from St. Paul and the First Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation) by disciplining ourselves; and, last but not least, to put the command to love God and neighbor into effect by our humble and obedient service to Him in thanksgiving for our salvation in Christ and through our compassionate acts toward one another.

We've heard the cycle of readings proclaimed year after year to the point where, perhaps, they and the homilies preached on them have become nothing more than "white noise" in the background of Lent. Or we can be doers of the Word, and not merely hearers, as St. James says. Let this Lent be different as we make our way to Jerusalem with Christ, that you and I may be transfigured and transformed and come to share in the glory of His victory. The going may be tough, but the grace of God is with us. So, don't just *hear* what God has to say to you, but *listen* and truly live!
