From the Pastor's Desk:

"Drink and Live"

Did you know that roughly 60% of your body is water? Did you also know that an average human being can survive only about three to five days without an intake of water? It's essential to our physical existence, as essential as oxygen. Moreover, a sustainable supply of fresh water is critical to the growth of crops and livestock. People have gone to great lengths (and dug to great depths) in order to obtain it, and battles have been fought over water supplies. As fearsome as floods can be to public safety, the threat of drought is even more terrifying. Small wonder that the Israelites in the reading from the Book of Exodus were in panic mode!

The Samaritan woman in today's Gospel passage braved the midday heat in order to get a heavy bucket of water from an old cistern. She avoided "polite company", as she had a rather colorful past, having had five husbands and now was living with Number Six. It's the same number of foreign powers, each forcing worship of their particular pagan gods, that had dominated the Samaritans, who came to practice a form of tainted, watered-down Judaism. As a result, Jews and Samaritans did not get along with one another, and Jews would rather take the long way around, going back and forth across the River Jordan when traveling between Jerusalem and Galilee, just so as not to cross through Samaritan territory.

Nevertheless, Jesus decided to take the direct route home with His disciples, cutting through Samaria and stopping near Sychar, the main site of Samaritan worship, just as Jerusalem was for the Jews. There He met the woman as she went about her daily, backbreaking labor and engaged her in conversation after asking her for water, thereby committing at least two major cultural taboos.

Then Jesus talked about giving her water, not from the cistern, but "living water", and she was intrigued by the prospect, there being no streams nearby. Now the story really gets interesting, and a bit confusing, too, for Jesus was speaking on a higher, spiritual level while the woman understood on a lower, physical one. (That happens frequently in the Gospel according to St. John.) As it turns out, He wasn't talking about potable water after all, but the flowing water of the Holy Spirit, "the Lord and Giver of Life", Whom He would send from the Father, just as we profess in the Creed each Sunday.

This is the same Holy Spirit Whom you and I received at the time of our Baptism, when the blessed water was poured over our heads, and the very life of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – entered into our souls, making us children of God and members of the Mystical Body of Christ, which is the Church. It is this same Holy Spirit Who is given to us in the Sacrament of Confirmation to strengthen us in our relationship with God and in continuing our role in the mission of Christ for the sanctification of the world, i.e., a Gift to be used.

Our experience of the living water of the Spirit is affected by our own encounter with Jesus Christ, Who has come and met us in the territory of our fallen souls, Who invites us into conversation with Him in prayer, and Who desires to bring us along with Him into the fullness of life. Like the Samaritan woman, we should be so filled with joy at our encounter with the One Who satisfies our thirst for life that we want to share Him with those around us. We do this first by familiarizing ourselves with Him in prayerful reflection on the Scriptures and our regular celebration of the Sacraments that He has bestowed upon the Church, and then following Him faithfully by putting His teachings into practice.

The "water of life" doesn't come from a tap, or a stream, or a reservoir, no less from a cistern. It comes abundantly to those who seek it with open hearts and minds, granted freely by the grace of a loving God and Father at the request of His Son through the power of His Holy Spirit. Ask for this wonderful Gift; drink deeply, and truly live!
