#### From the Pastor's Desk:

## "Seeing Reality"

There's an expression that we use from time to time: not being able to see the forest for the trees. We get so tied up in the details that we fail to see the bigger picture. That can happen with the Scriptures that are proclaimed during Lent, especially when we use the readings from Cycle A, the first year of the Lectionary. We might find the stories that are presented to be entertaining, after a fashion, but we just as easily can forget that this year's readings have been used by the Church for years as part of the preparation of candidates who will be received into the Church at the great Vigil Mass of Easter.

The first reading speaks to us of God's selection of David, a lowly, young shepherd boy, to become the great leader of His People. Whodathunkit? No one, not even David's own father or Samuel, the prophet of the LORD, suspected the choice, yet there it was. David was the one on whom God had set His eye to liberate His people. "Not as man sees does God see," God tells Samuel, "because man sees the [outward] appearance, but the LORD looks into the heart." How true that is of us, as well! Yet, God has chosen us to be His children by adoption, members of the Church, the Mystical Body of Christ.

St. Paul reminds us that, because of this election, we are to shun the darkness and evils of the world and to live differently, as people of the Light. We can have no part in accepting and perpetuating the darkness and lies of the world around us. Instead, we are to identify them for what they are and to refute them, walking in the light that comes from Christ by the grace of His Spirit, Who guides us in the way of absolute truth. Our encounter with Christ should make a difference in the way by which we live in the world without being "of the world".

This encounter, however, is not a one-shot deal. Instead, our relationship with Christ is supposed to grow one day at a time with every situation of life. In a way, it is akin to the experience of the man in today's Gospel passage. His washing is symbolic of our Baptism. Gradually, founded on his miraculous healing, he moves from talking about "the man called Jesus" to referring to Him as "a prophet" to one who is "from God" to calling Him "Sir" (the Greek word is "Kyrios", which the Church uses for "Lord"), and from merely explaining what occurred to defending the reason for his new-found belief.

Similarly, though less dramatically, we progress in our understanding, our "seeing", of God's love for us in giving us Jesus as our Savior and Redeemer. Coming to see Him as such, however, is not all cakes and ale. Just as the healed man was thrown out of his society, we, too, can be pushed aside by our peers when we hold fast to the teachings of Christ and His Church.

It probably won't happen because we profess the Trinity or the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist or the Immaculate Conception of Mary. But it is certain to happen if we recognize the need to avoid that in which the world revels: sin and whatever leads us into it. It will happen when we admit that we are in need of God's mercy and forgiveness and that we need to reform our lives. It will happen in clashes over issues of moral behavior, great and small. It will happen in the current cultural battles over the objective truth of human sexuality and the nature of man and woman, and the specialness and sacredness of all human life from the very instant of its conception until the exhalation of its very last natural breath.

This holy season of Lent is a time to look and see that God has chosen us for His own. Through regular prayer and the grace of the Sacraments that sustain our practice of the Faith, we will come to recognize Christ's presence and the power of His Holy Spirit more perfectly, enabling us to follow Him with greater devotion and fidelity until the day when we stand before Him and see Him as He is.
