From the Pastor's Desk:

~ Joy in the Midst of Suffering ~

There's a strange thing about Palm Sunday: The sacred Liturgy begins with us being all upbeat and excited as we hear the Gospel account of Christ's triumphal entry into the Holy City of Jerusalem, but by the time we walk out the doors of the church an hour later, waving a fistful of palm fronds, we will have heard the sorrowful account of the Lord's Passion and Death. The liturgies for the rest of the week keep us contemplating this same Mystery each day as we move towards the Holy Triduum and the central account of the Passion by St. John on Good Friday. Although Mass is not celebrated during the mornings of the Triduum, Morning Prayer each day helps us to continue that focus.

Now, if we were reading or hearing the story for the first time, we might have a tendency to get more than a little depressed. Certainly, our Lady, the Apostles, and the other disciples shared that horrible sentiment as the events unfolded around them and their world collapsed. Nevertheless, with 20/20 hindsight, we go through the narrative and the liturgies with a sense of hope founded on faith. We DO know the end of the story, and it doesn't take place on Good Friday with the bitter loneliness of a freshly sealed tomb. Thus, we wait in joyful hope for the celebration of the Lord's victory in His Resurrection on Easter morning. As it is, we do not remember simply the events of two thousand years ago, but rather the Mystery of God's love for us in Christ Jesus, renewed each day. Every holy Mass is for us a participation in His great victory of grace over sin, of light over darkness, of hope over despair, and of life over death.

One might say that we, indeed, that the whole world, are in a constant period of the Passion. We move about our daily routines in a world that sadly is beset by fears and confusion, sickness and death, and the threats of war or economic collapse, not to mention natural disasters and our own personal cares, worries, and tribulations.

Although we have moved beyond the fears and effects of the pandemic of 2019, Good Friday certainly has taken hold of us; Holy Saturday can be somber and sad; the glory of Easter very well might be the last thing on our minds. Nevertheless, we DO know the whole story. We DO know about the victory of Christ, and it DOES give us hope to deal with our many difficulties and fears.

So much has changed in the course of these last three years, but we always are called to act with determined perseverance as a people of faith. We also must continue to pray – especially to offer holy Mass and a daily Rosary and for the intercession our patron saints – for the many intentions that we have as individuals and as members of families, as a parish community and as part of the universal Church, as a village and as a nation among nations. Let us pray for one another, as well, that we all may place our trust in God, Who loves us, Who bears our sufferings, and Who brings us into the fullness of life that was won for us through the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We are fortunate in being able to celebrate the sacred liturgies of Holy Week publicly this year with the pandemic well behind us, a sad and often painful memory. As the number of parishioners coming to Mass on a weekly basis is returning to post-COVID "norms" little by little, I hope that you will join the priests of our Parish in observing these holiest of days in church, and that you will pray in your homes each day, as well, meditating on the daily readings.

There is no Resurrection at Easter without the Passion and Cross of Good Friday, but truly Good Friday always is followed by a joyful Easter Sunday. So it was for our Lady and the disciples two thousand years ago, and so it shall be for us today. By the grace of God, there will be joy in the midst of suffering once again!
