#### From the Pastor's Desk:

## ~ Christ is risen! Truly is He risen! ~

While looking over the last few years of my Easter messages this past weekend, I noticed how much has changed over the last few years, but I also realized how much has remained the same.

Three years ago, our celebrations were "virtual", confined to home for the most part because authorities, both civil and religious, had closed our churches. While priests celebrated Mass privately (though often with live-stream feeds over the internet) the faithful were told that "an act of spiritual communion" would have to suffice to feed the needs of their souls. How wonderful it is that today so many people have returned to church to celebrate the holy Sacrifice of the Mass on a regular, weekly basis! Our numbers last weekend finally were pre-pandemic.

One thing that has not changed is that there has been no stopping the advance of the Gospel, the great victory proclamation of God's love for us in Christ Jesus, Who suffered, died, and rose from the dead, thereby reconciling all mankind to God the Father and opening for us the gates of Heaven and eternal life. We remain an "Alleluia (Easter) people" as St. Augustine called his North African congregation over 1,600 years ago. That also was a time of great social upheaval amid wars, a decaying sense of polity, and rampant diseases. Despite our many difficulties – whether personal, communal, or global – we still join the generations of disciples before us in proclaiming our faith in the One Who has saved us.

Another Lent has come and gone. Hopefully, we are better Christians for whatever exercises of prayer, fasting, and sacrificial sharing we were able to accomplish by the grace of God. Now we celebrate an Easter of renewed hope, peace, and joy. As St. Paul reminded his disciples in Corinth almost two thousand years ago we are new creations in Christ. Having died with Him in the waters of Baptism, we, too, have been brought to newness of life, a life that has no end, a participation in His own divine life with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit.

We celebrate Christ's triumph of life over death, of grace over sin, of God's mercy and love over shame and despair. Through the victory of our blessed Lord, a new and fuller life has been given to the human race, indeed, to all of Creation. An ancient prayer of the Eastern Church reminds us that

"Christ is risen from the dead,

by death He has trampled down death,

and on those in the grave He has bestowed life."

Therefore, we do not simply go back about our business after the exercises of Lent. This most holy feast of Easter demands not only that we cry out, "Alleluia!" ("Praise the Lord!"), but also, and most especially, that we truly live in the freedom of the children of God, putting our Savior's teachings into effect through lives of prayerful sacrifice and compassion, avoiding sin, and responding to the grace of God by participating as active members of His Church.

We are to live as a people of hope, even in the face of difficulty and derision, of trials and tribulations. Truly, we have been changed because of the victory of Christ in which we already participate by virtue of our baptism. We ought to reflect that radical change each day with hearts and souls made new and strengthened through the Blood of Christ and the power of His Resurrection.

The Paschal Candle burns once more as a beacon of hope, shining on a dreary world that trudges in the darkness of sorrow and despair. We must bear the Light of Christ, bringing it into our homes and the world around us.

May God Who has begun the good work in you bless you and yours this Easter and bring it to completion in the Day of our Lord Jesus Christ! Indeed, let us raise the ancient, joyful cry of Holy Mother Church: "Christ is risen! Truly is He risen!"
