From the Pastor's Desk:

~ Only One Road Will Get Us There ~

The manager of the branch office where I worked right after graduating from college had a number of sayings that he would use to guide us. Among his favorites was, "If you don't know where you're going, any road will get you there." It was his way of reminding us that we had to set clear goals and then to plan carefully the means by which we would achieve them.

Small wonder, perhaps, that St. Thomas was more than a little puzzled when Christ stated that He was going to leave the Apostles for a while before returning to take them with Him for good, and that they knew the way. As disciples of Christ with 20-20 hindsight, the "where" of the goal is clear: eternal life that Christ has prepared for us in the House of the Father. The means by which we are to get there also is clear, as laid out by the Lord in today's Gospel passage: "I Am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." I.e., there is no salvation except through Jesus Christ. That is a statement that no other religious leader in history ever has dared to declare to his followers.

This is not to say that the road to Heaven is a smooth one without any difficulties, or bumps and potholes, or twists and turns. We can see from the first reading today that even the early Church had problems in providing services to its members and risked the possibility of getting off mission. Hence, the institution of the order of deacons was devised in order to free up the Apostles to concentrate on prayer, proclaiming the Gospel, baptizing, and celebrating the Eucharist. The Church in our own time continues to struggle, internally as well as from external pressures, as we try to continue Christ's mission of salvation.

We do not strive for that goal on our own: Christ has provided the guidance of His word, the counsel of the Holy Spirit, the grace of the Sacraments through which He remains present in His Church, and the heroic examples of the witness of countless saints. He also has given the Church a basic structure of hierarchy through the ministry of those who are ordained for service to her members. No bishop, priest, or deacon can assume the responsibilities of office and service on his own initiative, but only in responding after much prayerful discernment to the possibility of being called by the Lord through the promptings of His Holy Spirit.

Whether ordained or not, however, every Christian is called to the service of the Church, to use whatever gifts and talents we have received for building up the Mystical Body of Christ, thereby aiding in the proclamation and promotion of the Gospel. This is as true today as it was nearly twenty centuries ago. We all are supposed to be workers in the Lord's Vineyard one way or another. Jesus told His Apostles the night of the Last Supper, "whoever believes in Me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these because I am going to the Father."

True discipleship means that we participate as best we can, depending on our station and the situations of our life. Union with Christ requires action on our part. Complacency has no place in the Church; Catholicism is not a spectator sport. It demands that we express our faith actively, carrying out Christ's commands to repent of our sins and to lead lives of holiness and charity, strengthened by His grace and supported by prayer, especially the celebration of the Sacraments.

Prayer, sacrifice, and acts of loving service never go out of style. Regardless of who we are or our condition in life, each of us can follow the Master Who is the only Way into the Father's Kingdom, the incarnate Truth of the Father's boundless love, and the fullness of the Life that has no end. Each of us can show Christ that we love Him, directly and through our humble service to one another.

Christ has set our goal. He helps us to achieve it, for He is a God Who keeps His promises. We know where we're going. Only one road will get us there. Be on it!
