From the Pastor's Desk:

~ Another Advocate ~

The Easter Season is winding down once again, and the Sunday Gospels prepare us for Christ's ascension into Heaven, which we will celebrate this Thursday, as well as the coming of the promised Holy Spirit, which we will celebrate in a couple of weeks on Pentecost, the conclusion of the Season.

The timeline is more than a little confusing: initially we had post-Resurrection stories, but we've been back in the Upper Room on Holy Thursday evening for the last couple of weeks, as Christ gives His last pre-Passion address and instruction to His disciples and offers His priestly prayer for them to God the Father. To make matters even worse, our first readings all have come from post-Pentecost stories recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. How are we to keep things straight?

We have a tendency, I think, to want to put things in nice little boxes. It's one of the things that drive me nuts when Pope Francis tells people to "make a mess". Our following of Christ, however, is not so neat and orderly. It never was and never will be. Life is complicated, inconsistent, and full of surprises. Perhaps that's another reason why we need to rely so much on the Holy Spirit and why Christ has sent Him from the Father to assist us in living out His teachings. The Spirit Who unites Father and Son in the bond of mutual and eternal love is the One Who unites us to Christ and, through Him, to the Father.

To accept the teachings of Christ is not a mere academic exercise, nor simply the acquiescence of the mind. He challenges us in today's Gospel to get serious about our being His disciples and to demonstrate our love for Him by putting His commands (N.B.: *commands*, NOT suggestions!) into practice. Obedience is required, the same total obedience that Christ had in carrying out the will of the Father for the sake of our redemption and salvation. There is no such thing as "cheap grace", as Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the Lutheran martyr of WW II, reminded the world. Discipleship must be total, or it's nothing.

The call, or invitation, to discipleship is universal, as we see from today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, in which the faith takes root among even the hated Samarians, who finally received the Gift of the Holy Spirit Who had descended on the initial community of Jewish followers at Pentecost. While the call is universal, however, the response must be made on an individual basis, each person accepting the Gift and then living determinedly as a disciple of Christ.

This requires the work of our entire being, not just a matter of practice but also of the engagement of our spirit and our mind. We are to live each day recognizing that we are in the presence of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – into Whose divine life we were baptized, whether as infants, children, or adults. It requires careful reflection on and consideration of our faith to the point, as St. Peter says in the second reading, that we are prepared "to give an explanation to anyone who asks [us] for a reason for [our] hope" of eternal life in Christ. How many of us, this author included, are prepared to do so right now? I think we all have some considerable work to do before we take the stand.

Fortunately, we do have the grace of God, that Gift which is the consolation of the Holy Spirit, already within us. It remains for us, then, to put that grace to work in our lives. Christ told His Apostles that first Holy Thursday night that He would not leave them orphans. He tells us the same thing today and makes good on His promise each and every day, by never departing from us.

We have received Christ's commandments. Let us prove our love for Him by putting them into effect in the small as well as in the great things of our lives, so that the Father, too, may love us in Christ. The going very well may be rough and rocky, more bumpy and potholed than a Middle Village street, but be of good cheer, for Christ has given us another Advocate: the Spirit Who guides and defends us and Who makes incessant groanings of prayer to the Father on our behalf!
