From the Pastor's Desk:

~ Wait in Joyful Hope ~

While the rest of the country is celebrating the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord today, the dioceses of the Northeastern US and Omaha, having celebrated that solemnity on its traditional day, now are marking the seventh Sunday of Easter. It's sort of an in-between time, liturgically speaking. The Lord has risen to the Father to intercede for His Church, and the Church awaits the coming of the promised Holy Spirit to be sent by Christ from the Father. Our readings from Scripture reflect Christ's promise made in the past, and waiting to receive the future Gift, all while we live in the present moment as His faithful disciples.

The Gospel passage concludes a sort of "Farewell Discourse": five chapters combining Christ's final instructions to His Apostles and His urgent, heart-felt petitions to the Father on their behalf. There are very deep theological overtones throughout, too deep for a single homily, let alone one page in the bulletin.

Nevertheless, we can draw from today's Gospel reading, His "High Priestly Prayer", that Christ is bound to God the Father in the intimate bond of love that is the Holy Spirit. This is the same Spirit that He promised to send from the Father to His disciples to enable them (us) to continue His mission: the redemption and sanctification of the world. Christ, Who eternally shares the Father's glory, would manifest this glory through His suffering and death on the Cross, followed by His resurrection from the dead and ascension to the Father, whence He continues to intercede for us. Christ entered into this sacrifice of love to the Father by His own free will, and the Father confirmed His eternal glory through the Resurrection.

Like the Apostles waiting for the arrival of the promised Holy Spirit after Christ's ascension, we also are in a period of waiting, both liturgically and, in a larger sense, spiritually. We are preparing to celebrate the solemnity of Pentecost, but we also are to prepare by constant prayer and faithful lifestyle to receive the Gift of the Holy Spirit every day.

The Spirit is given to us at Baptism and His abiding presence is strengthened in us through the Sacrament of Confirmation, but He does not come just at what I like to call "the Kodak moments" of our lives. Every day and every situation presents us with opportunities to call upon the grace of the Holy Spirit to help get us through the difficult times, to be able to discern with divine wisdom how to choose what is right and just, good and holy in the eyes of God, and to have the courage to do even ordinary things for love of God.

This doesn't mean that life will be a peaceful walk in the park for followers of Christ. We will encounter suffering, sometimes just because we are His disciples in a world that wants nothing to do with Him. These are the times noted by St. Peter in the second reading today. If we're going to suffer, it's better to do so for what is right than for having sinned. "Whoever is made to suffer as a Christian should not be ashamed but glorify God because of the Name" that we bear.

There's no need for us to go looking far and wide for trouble and suffering. It will catch up with each of us sooner or later. Our sufferings, however, are not meaningless or without purpose. We can unite ours to Christ's and thereby share with Him both suffering and glory. As Christ has conquered sin – everything in the world that opposes God – so we, too, can conquer sin on a personal level.

The translation of the Mass celebrated prior to today's version used the expression after the Lord's Prayer that "we wait in joyful hope" for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. We wait in that same spirit of joyful hope and anticipation for the coming of His Holy Spirit at Pentecost. But why wait?

Entrust yourself to the Spirit and pray each day, "Come, Holy Spirit, and fill the hearts of Thy faithful; enkindle in us the fire of Thy Love." Wait in joyful hope, yes, but get active today and allow the Holy Spirit to transform and strengthen you to live more faithfully as a disciple of Christ and so share His glory.
