From the Pastor's Desk:

~ Unity and Diversity ~

It seems like we just celebrated Easter, and here we are at the end of the Easter Season: the solemnity of Pentecost, the birth of the Church by the descent of the Holy Spirit upon a gathering of Christ's disciples. Actually, our readings today present two appearances of the Spirit: rather dramatically in the first reading and more sublimely in the Gospel. In between, we have St. Paul reminding his congregation in Corinth that the Holy Spirit is operative in their daily lives.

Our impression of Christ's sending forth of the Spirit from the Father is influenced greatly by St. Luke's account in the Acts of the Apostles. It is a scene worthy of Cecil B. DeMille, complete with the images of a gale-force wind and tongues of fire settling over the disciples – by tradition, the Apostles and our Lady. Adding to the wonderment are the many languages of the Mediterranean region that these uneducated and unsophisticated, yet suddenly emboldened and eloquent, backwater Palestinian locals start to speak, astounding the crowd of pilgrims who had come to Jerusalem from all parts of the Empire.

The Gospel, on the other hand, takes us back to the first post-Resurrection appearance of Christ to His frightened Apostles on Easter Sunday evening. Christ gives them a Gift (the Holy Spirit) and sends them forth, true "apostles" ("those who are sent forth"), with His authority to extend or withhold forgiveness of sins. Both are present in the Church today: the first is given to all of us at our baptism, and the second is exercised through the ministry of the ordained priesthood.

Too often, we relegate the Holy Spirit to special moments like today's feast of Pentecost or the Sacrament of Confirmation. We don't do much celebrating of His presence otherwise. Maybe it's because we have so many images of Christ in the Gospels and of God's active appearances in the books of the Old Testament but so few images of the Holy Spirit beyond today's readings. Yet each of us constantly experiences the Spirit, even though we may not realize it, for it is through His power that we live and move and have our being.

The Holy Spirit, St. Paul reminds us, acts in and through each and every disciple in a vast and wonderful variety of ways, as varied as the number of persons, yet the same Spirit unites all of us as members of the one Mystical Body of Christ, breaking down the irrelevant differences while celebrating the different manners in which the Spirit is active. The effect is one of a necessary unification that allows for a splendid diversification.

Let me offer an illustration (trust me, it's not an original idea of mine): We have here at St. Margaret's, as in many churches, beautiful stained glass windows of saints who have inspired generations of worshippers. Standing out in the parking lot or on the street, the daylight is not terribly remarkable. It might be bright or not, but it is consistent. It is only when it filters through the pieces of multi-colored glass that it makes a beautiful impression. Similarly, at night the light in the church helps us to see, but it is only when it passes through the colored glass and out into the darkness that it shows forth beauty.

The light of the Holy Spirit acts along those lines with us, as if we were the many panes of glass. It is the same light that passes through each of us, but the effect is as different as there are the numbers of us. Each of us, using the varied gifts of the Spirit that we have received, is to allow those gifts to shine through us for the benefit of the world around us, each one according to our particular gifts.

The disciples at Pentecost spoke, and everyone heard them in his/her own language. The language of love of God and neighbor cuts across linguistic divides. It is a language that each of us can speak and in which each of us can be understood. Allow the great gift of the Holy Spirit to shine through you to illuminate a confused and darkened world, and to unite us more faithfully as members of the one Body of Christ as we celebrate the wonderful diversity bestowed upon us through His indwelling Spirit.


MONTHLY MEMORIAL MASS
