From the Pastor's Desk:

"Listen to Him!"

There are very few words of our Lady that are recorded in the Gospels. Similarly, there also are just a few words of God the Father recorded there. I find it interesting that both intersect in one very major point: the command to heed the instructions of their Son, Jesus Christ, Son of God and Son of Mary, true God and true man.

Mary's words in this regard were spoken to the servers at the wedding feast of Cana, when the wine gave out and she interceded with Jesus on behalf of the newlyweds, telling the servants, "Do whatever He tells you." The Gospel for today's feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord presents similar words from God the Father: "This is my beloved Son, in Whom I am well pleased; listen to Him!" The instructions cannot be any more imperative, yet they leave us plenty of room for implementation, as broad a range as the many situations of our daily lives.

Our first reading today is from the prophetic Book of Daniel, written a couple of centuries before the time of Christ. It presents a vision of Heaven with "One like a Son of Man" standing before the Ancient One, God, both of them in great and majestic splendor. "Son of Man" would become, by the Gospels, a title for the Messiah promised by God to His people through the Patriarchs, Moses, and the Prophets.

The scene in our Gospel passage reflects a similar glorious appearance with Jesus, the fulfillment of the Son of Man prophecies, transfigured (transformed) in the sight of His three astounded disciples as Moses and Elijah conversed with Him. It is a representation of the Law and the Prophets testifying to His Divinity. Giving even fuller testimony is the presence of God the Father (the Voice) and God the Holy Spirit (the enveloping Cloud) and the words of the Father quoted above. The appearance given to Peter, James, and John to strengthen them for what lay ahead and to give them hope – Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection – is given for our benefit, too, for those difficult and troubling times in our own lives. St. Peter affirms the apparition, telling his readers and us that we'd be wise to be attentive to the reliable and prophetic message "as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until day dawns and the morning star [Christ] rises in [our] hearts."

All of the promises that God made to His Chosen People over the centuries through the Patriarchs and the Prophets have been fulfilled in Christ. Despite the absence of the special effects of today's readings, we enter into the Mystery of God's *Presence par excellence* whenever we receive Jesus Christ, the totality of the Father's love, in every Holy Communion. We are to be in state of grace, absolved sacramentally and free from all attachment to mortal sin, as a preparation for our reception of this most precious Gift of the Holy Eucharist.

We can enter further into the Mystery each day by acting upon our faith and putting the teachings of Christ into effect in the great and small occasions of our lives, cooperating with the grace of God, and being *taken*, *blessed*, *broken*, and *given* in loving service to God and one another, thereby becoming mystically that which we receive: the Body of Christ.

We have been invited to have an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ as His faithful disciples, receiving Him in Word as well as in the Sacraments that He has given to His Church as a means of being with us at all times. This, just like any other relationship, requires time and effort on our part in order to develop solidly and fruitfully. Only then can we truly follow the instructions of our Lord's Father and Mother: *Listen to Him; do whatever He tells you!*


