From the Pastor's Desk:

"Who do YOU say I am?"

Summer is often a time to slow down and regroup mentally and physically, a time for some R&R. We meet Jesus with His closest disciples today in a sort of oasis in northern modern-day Israel, a place to rest and reflect and to discuss matters away from the usual bustle of crowds. There are no parables or miracles today, but Jesus asks them a couple of questions. First, who do the people think the Son of Man (a title for the Messiah) is? The Twelve give stock answers based on what they've heard from the crowds. They're not even close to being correct. Then He asks them point blank and personally, "But you, who do YOU say that I am?"

Moving from mere hearsay information, Christ challenges the Twelve to make a commitment. No longer can they simply go by popular opinions and polls. There can be no sitting on the fence. They have to make a choice, a declaration and profession of their own faith in Him that will require clear words backed by a tremendous commitment on their part, even to the point of dying for Him.

Simon sticks his neck out and gives the correct answer: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!" Now, Simon says this not because he's a genius or has made an in-depth study of Scripture or because he's considered the matter for some time. The Father, through the Spirit, has moved him to this insight. In return, Christ bestows two gifts on Simon: a new name and a new position. He is renamed Peter (*Petros* in Greek, *Cephas* in Aramaic), "the Rock", and he is given the high-priestly custody of the "keys to the Kingdom of Heaven", to absolve sins or not, as he sees fit.

Peter's answer forms the foundation of what the Church believes. We do not follow just one more prophet among others or even the last and greatest of them. We follow the Incarnate Word, the only-begotten Son of the Father, Who has come from the Father to atone for sins and to reconcile mankind with God. The ancient Fathers of the Church are in agreement that the other Apostles share in what Peter receives as their head: the authority to forgive sins. This sacred office and privileged gift continue today through the ministry of priests, as the successors of St. Peter and the other Apostles, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The question that Christ posed to His twelve closest disciples is the same question that He asks each and every one of us: "Who do YOU say that I am?" How do we answer such a question? Our response cannot be simply an empty statement that we've picked up from study, or have heard from our elders or in some homily. It is more than a simple matter of book learning. Our response must be given not only with the assent of the mind but also, and most especially, by the way that we live our lives as people of faith in intimate union with Jesus Christ.

We have not been created as automatons or walking encyclopedias of religious information. Neither are we merely workers in some social services corporation or members of a prayer group. God has created us for Himself, St. Augustine says, that we might have an intimate relationship with Him in Christ, sharing in the Divine life sacramentally now and, hopefully, in its fullness for all eternity.

We cannot call ourselves Christians, acknowledging Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God", and then act in knowingly open contradiction to His teachings and those of the Church that He founded, figuring that we always could ask for forgiveness afterwards. Yes, the mercy and compassion of God are beyond measure or human comprehension, but that would be the sin of presumption. God is no fool. He knows the intricate depths of the human heart and mind.

Discipleship in Christ is not a buffet from which we get to choose whatever meets our personal tastes and fancies, leaving the less appealing parts of the Gospel behind. It must be all or nothing at all. If you cannot accept or live according to the teachings of Jesus Christ and His Church, you will have to call yourself something else, for the title of "Catholic Christian" has been taken.

It is difficult in these trying times to be a faithful, practicing disciple of Christ, but when has it not been so? We must remember that all of us, in fact all people, are called to live a life of holiness, to act with justice, to stand up for the truth, and to respect the sacred and intrinsic dignity of every human life as having been created in the image and likeness of God, regardless of how the world may ignore Him or try to shut Him out from the human conversation. Christ promises in today's Gospel that even the gates of hell will not hold out against His Church. We are supposed to be that Church today, the Church Militant, warriors for Christ.

So, live boldly, my brothers and sisters, and answer with conviction the question, "Who do YOU say that I am?" Proclaim by your way of life, to the glory of God the Father, that *Jesus Christ is Lord!*
