From the Pastor's Desk:

"What Kind of Fruit?"

Years ago many homes in Middle Village and Maspeth had arbors of Concord grapes in their yards. They were too tart for plucking and eating off the stem but suitable (with added sugar) for making jams and jellies. We kids often used the grapes as ammo for our version of juvenile "war games", much to the displeasure of our elders, who had tended the vines so carefully during the growing season.

While many of the arbors have disappeared, some can be found today in our neighborhood. They still require much work and attention, from the proper trimming of the branches and shoots in the spring, to feeding and watering and protecting the maturing grapes from the depredations of insects (and kids like my buddies and me), to, hopefully, harvesting a bountiful crop in the end. The last thing that a grower ever wants to see is no produce on the vines in the fall.

Today's Scriptures continue the vineyard images of the last two weeks. In ancient times, the Kingdom of God, represented by the People of Israel, also was referred to as the "Vineyard of the LORD". Establishing it upon the Covenants, God had tended it carefully for centuries through the guidance of His prophets, some of whom were ignored while others were persecuted. Despite His efforts, the human response often produced the wrong or no fruit. Even after sending His Son at last, the results were appalling. Thus, Christ gave notice to the religious leaders of His time that the Vineyard, i.e., the Kingdom of God, would be taken away from them and given to others. Those "others" are the Church that He founded on the Apostles and which is supposed to continue His mission today.

You and I here in Middle Village have been placed as workers in our little corner of the Vineyard called St. Margaret's. We, too, are to cultivate it by the way that we live our lives, so as to produce the fruit of good works, our faith expressed in acts of love and compassion, of mercy and forgiveness. God gives us everything that we need in order to produce an abundance of good fruit: His Word and Sacraments, the examples of saints and good people we have known, and the guidance of His Church. He even trims away the dead wood in our lives, our own sinfulness and self-centeredness, so that we might bring forth an abundance of goodness and righteousness, proclaiming the truth of the Gospel message and our faith in Christ Jesus with courage and conviction, and acting with true justice.

Sadly, we live in a society – both secular and religious – in which many prefer to have wild grapes and weeds, the Vineyard trampled underfoot by sin, and the undoing or abandonment of the age-old teachings of the Church in order to effect a compromise with the spirit of the age instead of fidelity to the Spirit of God. Today's prophets who have the courage to proclaim the Faith openly in the face of ridicule continue to meet with indifference or outright opposition, while some who mislead are lauded. Catholic leaders and laity and other Christians who keep to the Church's traditional values of faith and morals often are chided or ignored by those who want a distorted "religion" or no part of the Church's teachings at all.

As he did with his disciples in Philippi, St. Paul exhorts us instead to hold fast to what our forebears in the Faith have handed down to us and we have received – to whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, gracious, and praiseworthy. We are to reflect upon these things and to act accordingly.

The question remains as to what fruit, if any, God will find us producing. The answer lies in our response to His invitation and grace to live the fullness of life as His beloved sons and daughters by adoption. Will we listen to His Son and live by His teachings, producing the fruit of good works faithfully and so share in His eternal life? It's up to us, for God invites, but He does not force any more than the grower forces a vine to produce good fruit. God assists the growth by His grace and constantly nurtures our vines, but He also requires our human cooperation to produce the fruit. What kind of fruit shall it be?
