From the Pastor's Desk:

"Live Wisely"

Current events continue to take a grueling toll on us all: warnings of a possible resurgence of COVID (along with the emergence of a batch of other illnesses for which to be inoculated); new waves of angry riots; constant news reports of wars and possible threats to our safety; economic problems and political turmoil; even the confusion of the recent and bewildering "Synod on Synodality for a Synodal Church" in Rome. The list of cares and worries seems to grow daily.

So, it seems more and more imperative that we should place ourselves in the hands of God, overcoming our arrogance and misguided senses of independence, omnipotence, and self-importance, and our lack of charity and wisdom. In short, we need to use God's gift of wisdom and return to Him humbly and lovingly.

Wisdom is personified in the first reading; it represents a life of grace and good works in the Gospel parable. It does not mean being able to understand the mysteries of the universe but rather knowing what God expects of us. It doesn't come automatically, but develops through reflecting on the experiences of our lives through prayer and the Word of God in Scripture, guided by the teachings of the Church and by the lives of the saints we honor and the good people whom we have known and admired. Wisdom is readily available to those who pursue it, but its attainment requires us to persevere in our relationship with God as we reflect on life's situations. There is nothing magical about its acquisition.

The five foolish virgins in today's parable had misused the gifts that all ten had received to present their good works (represented by the lamp oil) at the great wedding feast of the Bridegroom, i.e., the coming of Christ at the end of time – the final event for which no one knows the day or the hour. The wise virgins came prepared, having responded to God's grace by producing the good works that He expected of all ten. Alas, their works could not be transferred or shared!

We can be like either set of virgins: foolish, if we improperly waste the gifts of time, talent, and treasure that God has granted us to use in His service; wise, if we use those gifts well to build up the Kingdom of God in service to one another. We easily can "fall asleep" in a state of unpreparedness when we cease to practice our faith each day. On the contrary, we also can "stay awake" by putting that faith into action, acting responsibly according to our station and situation in life, supported by our prayer life and regular celebration of the Sacraments.

Indeed, God does give us the gifts – everything that we need to carry out His will for us. Some day, sooner or later, He will ask each of us to give an accounting as to how we've used them. This being said, though, we should not live in fearful anticipation of imminent doom, but rather in joyful hope, trusting in God's love for us and recognizing the trust that He places in each one of us to carry out His will for our present good as well as our long-term happiness with Him in Heaven. If He expects much of us, it is because He has entrusted us with much in order to accomplish His loving intentions and desires for each of His children.

We are approaching the end of another liturgical year, and the Church's focus has turned once more to the four last things: death and judgment, Heaven and Hell. Too often we ignore these realities as being in the far distant future, but, whether we acknowledge them or not, they are very real and will come to pass in God's good time. Without obsessing or becoming morose over it, though, we should live in such a way as to be prepared to receive Christ whenever He comes at the end of our own time in this life, by knowing and doing the will of the Father.

One day we each must stand before the throne of God for personal judgment, as we shall see in the Gospel in two more weeks. While we wait in joyful and trusting hope for that day, let us live wisely before it is too late and we be caught off guard, using well the gifts of grace that He lovingly pours out on us in order to draw us ever closer to share in His eternal life.
