From the Pastor's Desk:

"The Gift beyond All Imagining"

Imagine that you intend to give a gift to that special someone in your life. Before you can give your gift, however, that person gives you an even greater gift, one to which yours cannot compare. Such are the scenes presented in today's first reading and Gospel.

David thought that he'd repay God for all the blessings that he had received by building God a grand temple in Jerusalem, a house in which God could dwell among His people rather than in the tent where the Ark of the Covenant had been kept for centuries. Surely, God would be grateful for David's gift (as if any building could contain Him).

Instead, God had something far grander prepared for David: a "house" – not a palace built of fine stone and cedar, but a posterity that would last throughout the ages. For a society that believed that one's memory was blessed and kept alive only through descendants, there was nothing greater to achieve or to receive, the Christian theological concept of eternal life not yet having been developed at that point.

In the Gospel passage, God's Gift of Himself to Mary also would outdo Mary's gift of herself to God. The Angel's greeting to her refers to her as "full of grace". In a sort of preemptive strike against Satan by the saving act of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection, there was no trace of sin in Mary's life, consecrated to God from the very moment of her conception. As if that were not enough, Mary was given the singular honor of being the true tabernacle and dwelling place of God in the midst of His creation. She was to be the Mother of God in the sense that the Child to be born of her would be truly God and truly human, as confirmed at the Ecumenical Council of Ephesus in 431.

That's all nice, but where does it leave us? What sort of gift can we give to God, when He constantly and immeasurably beats every gift that He is offered? Well, it's not a matter of competition, since we'd lose every time, but there is a sense in which we can match God. The only thing that we can offer God, Who has given us everything – our very life, our redemption from sin, and a share in His own divine life – is to offer Him ourselves. That is to say, we are to accept His grace in order to live as He has taught us through His Commandments, the Prophets, His Son, the teachings of the Church, the lives of the saints, and the example of the good people whom we ourselves have known.

This year, as happens every five or six years, we will celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent in the morning and the Vigil Mass of Christmas at 5 pm. (Sorry, no "twofers"!) Christ is not one more in a long line of prophets. He is the very fulfillment of all of the promises of reconciliation and salvation that God made to humanity from Adam and Eve onward. It's easy to get caught up in the sentimentality of this holy season, especially tonight with beautiful music and family suppers and exchanging of gifts, focusing on things that are so much less than the reality that we are going to celebrate. The distractions this year also may be great, between the wars abroad, social unrest in our own country, the resurgence of diseases, economic woes, natural disasters worldwide, and perhaps more personal losses, but our hope and our trust should remain with God, firmly supported by our faith in Him.

What can we offer to God, Who has no need of anything? He certainly doesn't need us, but He does want us. He has made us for Himself, St. Augustine said, to share His love; we are His, we belong to Him, sang the psalmist. At the same time, He is also ours. He is Emanuel, God with us, Who has given Himself to us despite our unworthiness, and so we are to give Him ourselves in return – body and soul.

We never lose or forfeit our lives when we surrender them to the will and love of our gracious God. It is only when we do that that we truly will receive the Gift beyond all imagining: no bows, ribbons, or wrappings, and even better than the gift that David received, for we shall receive the fullness of God's promises and the reality of eternal life, united with Him as His children in the joys of His Kingdom.

May the joy, peace, and love of the Christ Child be with you! God bless us, every one!
