From the Pastor's Desk:

"Offering a True Gift"

This Sunday, we Americans celebrate the solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord (most of the Church observed the traditional day yesterday, January 6). "Epiphany" has Greek roots, meaning manifestation, or showing forth, in this case, the Messiah being recognized by gentiles, represented by the Magi.

Who and how many these strangers were and exactly where they came from are not detailed in the Gospel account (only St. Matthew even refers to them). Tradition numbers them as three, because of the number of gifts that they presented (frankincense, gold, and myrrh), names them Gaspar, Balthazar, and Melchior, coming from lands representing the three continents known in the Roman Empire at that time: Asia, Africa, and Europe. The importance of the story is that salvation has come to the Gentiles through Jesus Christ, Who is true God and true man, the newborn "King of the Jews".

The point of the story that St. Matthew presents in his Gospel account is that God miraculously revealed to the Gentiles the birth of the Messiah promised to the Jewish people, One Who was rejected, or ignored by and even feared by His own people, who should have known better. St. Matthew drew on themes and incidents scattered throughout the Hebrew Scriptures in order to show that there was an authentic connection between the ancient promises that God had made to His people for century after century and the fulfillment of those promises in Jesus, the Child born in Bethlehem. All of the evidence lined up for St. Matthew perfectly, just as he knew that his readers should understand it

Our first reading from the Old Testament ties into the Gospel, since we also must understand the Old Testament in order to understand the New Testament. Several of the seemingly small details that we portray in our Nativity scenes (like the camels, the kings, and the gifts that they offered to the Infant) come from today's first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. Truly, it is a beautiful story, and it remains full of meaning for us more than twenty centuries removed from the actions presented.

The bottom line of today's feast and readings can be summarized by the last line of the second reading, from St. Paul's letter to his Gentile disciples in Ephesus in Asia Minor, "that the Gentiles are coheirs [with the Jews], members of the same Body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the Gospel." Fortunately, you and I are included among their number. The victory that God achieved in Jesus Christ is ours: the victory of grace, eternal life, and reconciliation with God over sin, death, and separation from Him.

Today's solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord often is referred to as "Little Christmas". Most Christians still celebrate it on January 6, twelve days after the solemnity of the Nativity of our Lord. Regardless of what it's called or when it is celebrated, its meaning and importance remain for us today: we, too, united as members of the Body of Christ, Who fulfilled the promises made over the centuries to the Chosen People, are spiritual descendants of Abraham and thereby heirs to God's promises. Gentiles though we are, we, too, can call Abraham "our Father in Faith" because of Jesus Christ.

God's promise of salvation and reconciliation now extends to all people of every land and time through Jesus Christ. All people are called to the universal Kingdom of God. Whether or not we accept the Promise and answer affirmatively is another matter, for answering in the affirmative and becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ will upset the apple cart and cost the follower his/her life. There is no such thing as cheap grace. Our eternal life cost the life of the Son of God; it will cost us our life as well, but in losing it for Him we shall find it.

We need not travel to far and distant lands in search of the Promised One to offer Him ornate gifts, as did the Magi. He is present to us in His holy Word, in His Sacraments, in His people (the Church), and in our souls. He wants to share His life with us. What can we offer Him in return? Each of us is called to manifest His presence by our lives, in all that we say and do. Thus, we do Him homage and proclaim Him by living as His faithful disciples, offering Him the true gift of our very selves, we who by His grace are His coheirs of the redemption that He has won for us!

We hold a holy hour of Eucharistic Adoration consisting of Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Rosary, litany, scriptural reading, and time for quiet, personal prayer from 9:30 until 10:30 am on the first Saturday of each month.

The next holy hour is Saturday, February 3.
