

From the Pastor's Desk:

"Repent and Come Follow"

Imagine an almost perfect stranger coming up to you and telling you to drop everything, including your job and family life, to change your ways radically, and to follow him, no questions asked. It's unlikely that most of us would comply any too quickly. Yet, that is exactly what Christ's first disciples – Simon and Andrew, James and John – did in today's Gospel passage.

Now, we may think that it was easy for them. After all, we might say, they had little to give up aside from backbreaking work, taking their chances on the water, and either dealing with smelly fish every day or coming home without a sufficient catch with which to feed their families and pay their bills. But we would be wrong. Fishing was in their blood; it was no idle hobby by which they passed a pleasant afternoon on the lake. These were businessmen with partners and employees, families and homes. They were not wealthy by any stretch of the imagination, and perhaps they barely eked out a living for themselves and their families, but they surely were people with something to lose: their livelihood, their way of life, their families, and even their very lives. Their positive response was as radical (and surprising to us) as was Jesus' call to them to follow Him.

How might we respond to that same call today? Are we prepared to repent of our sins and change our lives, removing all of the obstacles that separate us from God? Are we ready to drop everything to live the life of Christian discipleship according to the Gospel, to take up our crosses each day and even to lay down our lives to follow Jesus, participating in His mission? As one Mid-west US bishop put it a few years ago, are we truly committed to following Jesus, or are we content simply to admire Him from a safe distance? Too often, it seems to me, we (myself included) tell Him, "Thus far shall You come into my life, but no closer."

There are questions that each one of us must answer for ourselves, sooner or later, and the sooner the better. None of us is guaranteed any particular length of years. None of us is marked with a "best if used by" date. Jesus calls us each day to reject sin and to accept the grace of God in order to live a life of holiness. Each day can be for us a new beginning leading to a richer life.

The Prophet Jonah in today's first reading tried initially to avoid the mission that he received from God to be an instrument of renewal. (We get an abbreviated version of the story today. The unabridged version takes a few minutes to read.) We might not take such a step, even accepting the mission grudgingly, but most of us also don't get so fired up and excited about our particular calling either.

While we may not leave everything behind, each of us must respond with commitment and dedication to proclaim our love for Jesus Christ by repenting of our sins and living as He commands us to live. It begins with a good examination of our lives and of our own need for forgiveness and mercy, just as every generation of disciples has had to do.

We also need to remember that the first four disciples were not left to their own devises to fulfill their part in the Great Mission. Jesus' words to them are quite clear: "Come after Me, and I will make you fishers of men." It is Christ Who empowers and enables us through the Gift of the Holy Spirit to complete the work to which He calls us.

"Repent! Come and follow Me," He says to each one of us. We, too, are to be fishers, catching people with the Gospel and drawing them in the net of God's love into a profound relationship with Christ and the fullness of life in the Father's Kingdom. How faithfully and eagerly will we respond to His challenge?

May God continue to bless you along your journey of faith and bring you to the eternal reward that Christ has won for us!
