From the Pastor's Desk:

"So Far, and Yet So Close"

If you're a Boomer like me, you might remember the Four Seasons song with the line, "So close, so close, and yet so far!" (Give yourself a pat on the back, if you still remember and can sing the rest of it!) Our God can be said to be the reverse of that idea, for, as distant as He is, living outside the limitations of time and space, He has chosen to be ever so close to us in the Person of Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Son of the Father, Who, in turn, has given us the Sacraments as a means of maintaining an intimate relationship between God and His Church.

Now, that can be a comforting idea, but it also can be a troubling one, as we see in today's first reading. The God of their ancestors was rather overwhelming and terrifying for the Israelites during the Exodus from Egypt to the Promised Land. They wanted and needed an intermediary, whom God provided by choosing Moses as His prophet (spokesman) to guide His people to freedom and newness of life. Moreover, God would continue to guide His people through subsequent prophets down throughout the centuries.

The idea of God's closeness to us also can be disconcerting. We might prefer to keep a "safe distance" between us and God, looking more for piety and religion than for a demanding relationship with the living God. Nevertheless, as disciples of Christ, our belief in His proximity to us in Word and in Sacrament, especially through His Real Presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament, should be a comfort and a joy that strengthens us and helps us to live the life of our calling as His disciples and children of God, following Him more faithfully day by day into the fullness of life in the Father's Kingdom.

One of the saddest things about the COVID restrictions that were forced upon us three years ago was the separation of Catholics from the reception of the Sacraments, especially the Most Holy Eucharist. We are a tactile people, for whom watching a Mass on TV or live-stream and making an act of spiritual communion truly is not an adequate substitute for assisting at Mass in person and receiving Christ, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. We also can't confess to a TV screen or to a computer, and neither of those can anoint the sick or baptize infants. Fortunately, we are now well beyond those tyrannical restrictions, yet so many of our brothers and sisters still have not returned to the community at prayer.

Our God does not appear to us in frightening lightning and thunder, or a pillar of fire, or a great cloud as He did during the Exodus that we should shy away from Him in fear and trembling. Moreover, He has sent us not just another prophet as He promised through Moses, but, "in the fullness of time", His only-begotten Son, the One Who faithfully witnesses to the fullness of the truth of the Father's love for us, and has made us His adopted children. It is Christ Jesus Who has freed us from sin and death and Who guides us through the deserts and tribulations of life into the perfect safety and joy of Heaven, our true and eternal Promised Land.

The Church throughout the world is in the midst of a three-year celebration of Eucharistic revival, building up to the next Jubilee Year in 2025. It is a celebration of Christ among us in a manner par excellence. We hold a monthly holy hour here at St. Margaret's on the first Saturday of every month after the 9:00 am Mass, complete with Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction, as well as some time for communal prayer and quiet, personal reflection. We do the same for young adults and others who wish to attend on the second Thursday of every month at 7:30 pm.

Come and adore the Lord Jesus! Draw near to Him Who is not a million miles away from us, but Who is in our midst. Speak to Him from your heart, and there listen to Him speak to you ever so quietly. Astonishing things can happen in our own time when we place ourselves in the hands of a loving God Who acts with power and authority – so far, and yet so close to us.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

We hold a holy hour of Eucharistic Adoration consisting of Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Rosary, litany, scriptural reading, and time for quiet, personal prayer from 9:30 until 10:30 am on the first Saturday of each month.

The next holy hour is Saturday, February 3.

Come and spend some quality time with the Lord and pray for our country!
