#### From the Pastor's Desk:

### "In God We Trust"

On the back of every US currency bill and on the front of every US coin is the expression, "In God We Trust". It's such an everyday part of our lives that we don't give it a second thought. When was the last time that you looked at the money in your pocket and said, "Oh, WOW! I really should!"?

The Scriptures today speak to us about trusting God. Elderly Abraham was prepared to sacrifice Isaac, his young son and heir, at the command of God, which would have ended the prospect of countless descendants that God had promised him in a covenant bond. Still, he placed his trust in God and proceeded to comply until the Angel of the Lord stopped him. Abraham had proven his faithfulness to God, and God would remain faithful to His part of the covenant. We, children of Abraham by faith, are part of God's delivery on His promise.

That sense of divine faithfulness is driven home by St. Paul in the second reading, which is full of rhetorical questions. Unfortunately, we get a sort of "Reader's Digest" version of what St. Paul wrote. His more fully developed point is that nothing can ever separate us from the love of God. Unlike Abraham, God did not spare His only-begotten Son for our salvation. God keeps His promises and has given us the best He has to offer. He readily grants us everything that we need so that we might share in His eternal life. His love is ours in Christ Jesus.

The first reading and Gospel passages on Sundays are always connected, the first supporting the latter and the latter fulfilling the first. So it is this Sunday as Moses and Elijah, representing the Law and the Prophets, bear witness to Christ, and we hear the voice of the Father booming from the cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him!"

The instruction is not simply to "HEAR what He says" but to "LISTEN to Him." There's a big difference in English and in many other languages, as well. We "hear" sounds around us all the time. Sometimes, they become "white noise," blending into the background as we go about our work, or read, or relax. To "listen", however, implies that we are focused and taking the message to heart. That is what the Father demands of the stunned Apostles; it is what He demands of us, who are confused.

Why should we listen? Jesus is no mere miracle worker or latter day prophet or philosopher. He is the very Son of God, God incarnate, coeternal and consubstantial with the Father. His teachings are not simply notions that would be nice to follow or, alternatively, okay to ignore if they prove to be too inconvenient for us. There's no voting on the matter. If you want to live for all eternity in the peace, joy, happiness, and love of the Father, then you very well had better listen, pay attention, take to heart, and live your life according to the teachings of Jesus Christ His Son.

This holy season of Lent is a particular period in which we pay special attention to Christ's teachings, to see how well we live up to them and to determine what we need to do in order to get back on track. Thus, we use all forms of prayer to communicate with God, almsgiving as a way to look beyond ourselves to the needs of others, and fasting as a means of self-discipline, so as to strengthen the bond, the covenant, that God has made with humanity through the Blood of His Son and thereby inherit His promise of eternal life.

If you feel as if you already are struggling with Lent, that may be a good sign. Take a look at where you are and where you need to be, then trust God and ask Him for the grace of conversion of heart to help you to achieve your goal. Take it in small steps, and do not get discouraged if progress comes slowly or even if you fall. Christians are works in process; what we have begun is the work of a lifetime, until the day when we, too, may be counted as "Saints among the Saints of Heaven."

"God did not spare His own Son, but handed Him over for us all; how will He not give us everything else along with Him?" Trust God! He will bring to completion the good work that He has begun in you, so that you might share in the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.
