From the Pastor's Desk:

~ Ignorance, Understanding, and Discipleship ~

Easter is the great feast of feasts of the Church, so important that we celebrate it not just on one day or for one week but for a full fifty days. In fact, every Sunday is said to be a "little Easter". Indeed, if we push the point, each celebration of Holy Mass can be called an Easter celebration, for each makes present for us the full Paschal Mystery of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

Today's Scriptures, building upon the post-Resurrection appearances of Christ and their aftermath, speak to us of actions: actions done in ignorance, actions done in rejection of the truth, and actions done with an enlightened mind.

First, St. Peter extends an olive branch of peace and reconciliation to his listeners in Jerusalem, recognizing that they had acted out of ignorance by their role in the death of Christ, which He underwent in obedience to the Father's will, thereby fulfilling the ancient Scriptures and becoming the means of universal salvation. "All" that the people had to do was repent of their sins and undergo a radical change of heart, turning from the corruption of old, sinful ways to the new life of grace. St. Peter's bold yet compassionate message applies equally to us today. We also need to reform our lives, repent of our sins, and be absolved of them through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Christ died for our offenses!

We may ask, "Why do I have to go to confession, reform, and repent? I haven't done anything wrong." St. John answers in today's reading from his first letter to his disciples in Asia Minor: Christ is THE expiation for the sins of EVERY person. Deny it as much as we might wish, we DO stand in need of that healing whenever we sin. Yet how often we act in a manner that is contrary to Christ's teachings, which are intended to guide us to a life of grace in union with Him and the Father through the Holy Spirit, thereby furthering God's Kingdom on earth!

It's difficult for us to grasp that anyone, even God, could love us so much as to die for us despite the wrongs we've done and then to give us the gift of eternal life. It was difficult, even troubling, for Christ's first disciples, as well, as they received Him with fear and confusion that first Easter night. Perhaps that's why He stayed with them for another forty days after His Resurrection, not only teaching them, but also strengthening their faith and preparing them to continue His mission throughout the world: to bring all people for all time into right relationship with God and the true peace, the fullness of eternal life, of the Kingdom of Heaven.

If we bother at all to read the Scriptures on our own, we might view them merely as strange stories from times long ago. Instead, we ought to read them with open minds and hearts, recognizing that the Old Testament prepares for the New, which, in turn, fulfills the Old. Both pertain to Jesus Christ completing the will of the Father in order to reconcile a fallen humanity to our loving and merciful God. That was the point that Christ made to His two disciples on the road to Emmaus and again as He appeared to the others afterwards in the Upper Room.

We act from time to time in ignorance or confusion or fear, or even consciously may deny our need for God's mercy. Each day, however, is another opportunity to examine our lives in the light of Christ's teachings and a time to open ourselves to the grace that God freely extends to us, sinners yet His beloved children. It doesn't end there, however, for, having experienced the grace of God and His forgiveness, we must reform our lives and then share in Christ's mission for the world's salvation. Proclaim God's merciful love by the way that you live!

May God shower you and yours with His love, His pardon, and His peace as we continue to celebrate Christ's victory with open minds and open hearts! Christ is risen! Truly is He risen!
