From the Pastor's Desk:

"Christ's Vibrant, Fruitful Branches"

It's difficult at times to get into a group, whether at school, at work, or in an organization or a parish society. It may take time for those already within the group to accept us during a period of formal or informal probation, after which there's usually a form of ritual acceptance. That seems rather normal. Imagine, though, if someone who had been hostile to the group later tried to join it. They're bound to have a rough time of it, if not encounter outright rejection by the members. Still, they know that the only way to survive is to join, to be part of that group.

Such was the case of Saul, who had persecuted the Church in Judea and was heading off to do the same thing in Damascus when he had his dramatic, totally life-changing encounter with Christ. It took some doing for the disciples to accept him, but that did not deter him. He realized that he had to belong to Christ and that his life would be a meaningless waste without Christ. From the time of his baptism in Damascus until the moment of his martyrdom in Rome about thirty years later, Saul (St. Paul) was inseparable from his Lord and Savior. Despite all of his sufferings as he proclaimed the Gospel of salvation in Jesus, all that he ever feared was being cut off from Christ. Can we say as much?

Christ tells us in today's Gospel that attachment to Himself is required of each disciple. Separated from Him like branches cut off from a vine, we wither and die. We flourish by the grace of God and produce the fruit of good works in love for Him and one another. We are called to do this, as St. John tells us in today's second reading, "not [merely] in word and speech but in deed and truth." Our discipleship must be real, active, and demonstrable in order to be effective.

I remember being in friends' and relatives' backyards as a boy and seeing the elders pruning their grape vines, carefully clipping off certain branches and bundling them up to be thrown away or burned. It looked like a lot of unnecessary, hard work and a waste of what I thought were good branches. Little did I know then that those branches had to be removed because the owner knew that they wouldn't produce any fruit but actually would drain strength from the vine, thereby inhibiting its production of bountiful clusters of good grapes.

In a way, that happens with us, too. God wants to prune away from us the sins and sinful inclinations that prevent us from producing the good that He knows we can accomplish with His care and grace. He strengthens us to remain connected as strong branches to the Vine, His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, and He nurtures us as we put Christ's teachings into practice, not as an optional, arbitrary philosophy, but as the way to true and eternal life. God takes delight in what we accomplish as we respond to His initiative, and, just as the sap gives life to the branches, so the Holy Spirit abiding in us gives life to our souls.

It's easy to be lukewarm and get lost in the sentimentality of the holidays and "Kodak moments" of our lives. It's quite another matter to persevere in the practice of the Faith, especially when the going gets tough. We should recognize at all times that God, Who loves us beyond all measure or imagination, has accomplished our salvation through the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of His Son. He does not force His will upon us but waits for us to act in the freedom of the children of God.

Sometimes, we live in anxious fear and hesitate to embrace God's love and calling; at other times, we have the courage to accept the grace that He offers us so as to live in fear (profound awe and respect) of the Lord. The former is dry, brittle, and sterile; the latter is supple and vibrant, and produces much fruit for the Kingdom of God.

Let us live and truly love, always united with our Savior, open to the power of His Holy Spirit constantly at work in us and through us, so that we may enjoy the fullness of life with our God and Father, to Whom be glory now and forever!
